Attached are details of the street crimes and burglaries reported to Tooting police between 25 November and 2 December, 2004

STREET CRIME

Offence	Place	Date	Time	Method
Street Robbery	BERBECK ROAD	24/11/2004	1315	Two white male suspects, aged about 31, pushed victim to the ground and stole his wallet.
Commercial Robbery	FRANCISCAN ROAD	25/11/2004	2212	Three suspects pushed shop owner and held another employee while they stole cash and phone cards from behind counter. 1) Male, black, 22 yrs, in a blue hooded top with "87" on the back, blue tracksuit trousers and a blue woollen hat 2) male, black, 22 yrs, in a white/cream hooded top, dark tracksuit trousers and a cream beanie hat 3) male, black, 22 yrs, in a dark blue hooded top and black tracksuit trousers.
Street Robbery	MORVEN ROAD	1/12/2004	2045	Thief used violence and stole property from victim. He was aged 30, of Mediterranean appearance, in blue jeans and a black cap.
Street Robbery	LONGLEY ROAD	29/11/2004	2000	Two suspects attacked victim in street, knocking him to the ground and kicking him. They then put him in a vehicle, took him home and pistol-whipped him in front of his family before stealing property. 1) Male, black, 17 yrs, in black hooded top and black jeans 2) male, black, 19yrs, in black hooded top, blue jeans and black cap.
Street Robbery	MITCHAM ROAD	29/11/2004	1730	Victim was hit on the head from behind by two male suspects, of Mediterranean appearance, who demanded money and searched his pockets.



Street Robbery	PRETORIA ROAD	28/11/2004 2015	Victim was threatened and punched in the face by two suspects who then stole property. 1) Male, white, 15 yrs, in a black, fur-lined, hooded jacket and jeans with a logo. 2) Male, white, 15 yrs, in a black fur-lined jacket and blue jeans.
Street Robbery	BRODRICK ROAD	26/11/2004 1115	As victim's car was stationary, the door was opened by a suspect who attempted to snatch her bag.
Street Robbery	BALHAM HILL	25/11/2004 0120	Four black male suspects, aged 18 - 20, all dressed in dark clothing with hooded tops, attacked female victim in communal area of flats. They then pushed her to the floor and stole her bag and wallet.
Street Robbery	COWICK ROAD	25/11/2004 1715	White male suspect, 23 yrs, used force to take cash from victim. He was wearing a white shirt and grey trousers.
Street Robbery	TOOTING BEC ROAD	23/11/2004 2110	Five 15 year old black youths punched victim in the head and stole his pedal cycle. They were all dressed in casual clothing.
Street Robbery	BALHAM HILL	15/11/2004 1600	14 year old black boy intimidated victim, forcing him to hand over cash.
Street Robbery	BLAKENHAM ROAD	14/11/2004 1900	By four suspects. No description.
Theft Snatch	RAVENSWOOD ROAD	27/11/2004 0030	Two suspects snatched victim's handbag. They were both aged 25, black, in dark jackets and caps.

Residential Burglary	BALHAM GROVE	27/11/2004 1600	27/11/2004 2245	Suspect forced window open and entered with intent to steal.
Non-Residential Burglary	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	30/11/2004 2230	1/12/2004 0945	Burglar broke hole through wall at rear, entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	29/11/2004 1855	29/11/2004 2020	Two male suspects entered through first floor window.
Non-Residential Burglary	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	27/11/2004 1800	29/11/2004 0945	Thief forced ground floor window, entered and stole.
Non-Residential Burglary	BLACKSHAW ROAD	24/11/2004 2240		Suspect forced window, entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	CHERITON SQUARE	29/11/2004 0730	29/11/2004 1845	Thief attempted to force open kitchen window using tools, causing damage.
Residential Burglary	CULVERDEN ROAD	1/12/2004 0910	1/12/2004 2345	Thief removed window, entered and stole.

Residential Burglary	MARIUS ROAD	29/11/2004 1800	30/11/2004 0930	Suspect entered garden shed through open window.
Residential Burglary	MAYFORD CLOSE	29/11/2004 0930	29/11/2004 1800	Suspects forced open kitchen window entered and stole several items.
Non-Residential Burglary	MITCHAM LANE	30/11/2004 1830	30/11/2004 2330	Thief removed board covering window and stole music equipment.
Residential Burglary	MOFFAT ROAD	25/11/2004 0830	25/11/2004 1930	Suspect forced open locked front window.
Residential Burglary	OLD HOSPITAL CLOSE	26/11/2004 0830	26/11/2004 2200	Suspect forced glass in bottom of back door, entered and stole.
Non-Residential Burglary	ROWFANT ROAD	28/11/2004 1500	29/11/2004 0700	Intruder entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	ST. JAMES'S DRIVE	26/11/2004 1745	26/11/2004 1827	Suspect entered after smashing glass in kitchen door and stole various items.
Residential Burglary	THRALE ROAD	25/11/2004 1500	26/11/2004 1900	Suspect entered and searched premises.
Residential Burglary	WELHAM ROAD	25/11/2004 1250	25/11/2004 1259	By 27 year old white male.

ASSISTANCE

Victim Support, tel. 0207 223 1234, is an independent charity that helps people cope with crime.

Trained staff and volunteers, based in local branches, contact people after a crime has been committed, to offer free, confidential support and information. The Police and other organisations refer victims of crime to Victim Support; however some people feel able to 'pop in' to one of our branches to ask for assistance.
