



## Tooting Crime Briefing

2 June, 2005

Attached are details of the street crimes and burglaries reported to Tooting police between 27<sup>th</sup> May and 2 June, 2005

### STREET CRIME

Offence	Street	Date	Time	Method
Street Robbery	<b>THRALE ROAD</b>	26/05/2005	2300	Two black male suspects stopped victim and took his property. One was wearing a blue top, and the other had a cream shirt, dark trousers and a light coloured baseball cap.
Street Robbery	<b>NIGHTINGALE WALK</b>	26/05/2005	1930	Four 19 year old black males held knife to victim's chest, threatened him and stole his bicycle. 1) Wearing a white cap with "NY " on, white tracksuit, white trainers and a black bandana 2) wearing blue jeans with a yellow stripe, blue shirt, black shoes and a red bandana 3) wearing a red bandana 4) wearing a black bandana.
Street Robbery	<b>TOOTING BEC ROAD</b>	26/05/2005	1735	Three thieves stopped victim and stole his mobile phone, wallet and laptop. 1) Male, aged 18, black, in a dark green hooded top, with white letter "N" on back, and dark baseball cap 2) male, black, aged 18, in black hooded jacket 3) male, aged 18, black.
Street Robbery	<b>NIMROD ROAD</b>	27/05/2005	1333	Suspect 1 and 2 ran up to VIW1 from behind, suspect 1 pushed her to the ground, and then tried to grab her bag from her arm. VIW1 held onto it, and they ran off
Street Robbery	<b>NIMROD ROAD</b>	27/05/2005	1333	Thief pushed victim to the ground and tried to steal her handbag. He was male, aged 15, black, in black tracksuit trousers and a navy baseball cap.



Street Robbery	<b>TOOTING HIGH STREET</b>	27/05/2005 1545	Three thieves threatened schoolchild and stole his mobile phone. 1) Male, aged 17, Asian, in light blue jeans and dark blue t-shirt 2) male, Asian, in black skull cap, dark blue V-necked t-shirt and with a poor complexion 3) male, aged 17, in black casual clothing.
Street Robbery	<b>OKEBURN ROAD</b>	28/05/2005 1800	Two males approached the victim and while one searched and punched the victim in the face, the other threatened him with a baseball bat. 1) Male, white, aged 13, in a black hooded top and black tracksuit trousers 2) male, white, aged 16, in a white Nike top, light denim jeans and a blue baseball cap.
Street Robbery	<b>TOOTING BEC ROAD</b>	29/05/2005 0020	Three black males pushed victim to the ground, punched him and stole property. One wore a black hooded top and black trousers.
Street Robbery	<b>TOOTING BEC ROAD</b>	29/05/2005 0200	Victim was followed by a black male, aged 37, who punched her to the ground and stole property. He was wearing a blue hooded tracksuit and trainers.
Street Robbery	<b>LEVERSON STREET</b>	30/05/2005 1715	By four thieves 1) aged 15, male, dark skinned European, in a hooded top 2) male, black, aged 15 in a navy blue hat 3) female, white, in a blue and white Nike tracksuit 4) female, black, aged 15 in a black tracksuit.
Theft Snatch	<b>BALHAM HILL</b>	31/05/2005 0025	Black male thief in a red baseball cap and black clothing snatched victim's bag.
Street Robbery	<b>MITCHAM ROAD</b>	31/05/2005 2010	Two victims were asked for money by an 8 year old black boy, who punched them when refused.
Street Robbery	<b>MOYSER ROAD</b>	31/05/2005 2100	Three 15 year olds attempted to steal property. 1) Female, black, riding a bike 2) male, black 3) male, white, in a denim jacket and jeans.
Street Robbery	<b>TOOTING GROVE</b>	31/05/2005 1600	Thief intimidated victim and forced him to hand over phone.



Street Robbery **UPPER TOOTING ROAD** 31/05/2005 1230

Three thieves stole cash from victim's handbag. 1) Male, aged 30, Asian 2) female, aged 30, Asian 3) female, aged 30, Asian, with shoulder length brown hair, and wearing beige trousers.

Theft Snatch **BALHAM STATION ROAD** 01/06/2005 1540

20 year old male snatched victim's mobile phone. He was wearing a dark grey hooded top, possibly with a "Gap" logo and dark blue tracksuit trousers.

Residential Burglary	HESLOP ROAD	25/05/2005	1730	25/05/2005	1800	Thief forced padlock and entered store, then took tools and building materials.
Residential Burglary	FERNLEA ROAD	26/05/2005	1800	26/05/2005	2150	Two burglars smashed window in front room entered and stole a video player and mobile phone They were both white aged 16; one was male and the other female
Residential Burglary	YUKON ROAD	26/05/2005	1500	26/05/2005	1545	Black male, aged 30, forced entry and stole property. He was wearing one-piece dark blue overalls.
Non-Residential Burglary	RITHERDON ROAD	27/05/2005	1700	31/05/2005	0800	Suspect broke back window, entered, searched, and stole money.
Residential Burglary	BALHAM HILL	28/05/2005	0200	28/05/2005	0700	Suspect climbed through open window of victim's flat and then stole credit cards and phone whilst victims slept



Residential Burglary	CORSEHILL STREET	28/05/2005	1800	31/05/2005	1630	Intruder entered and stole
Residential Burglary	CULVERDEN ROAD	28/05/2005	1945			Two intruders kicked door open and stole car key 1) Male black aged 15 in a dark blue hooded tracksuit with vertical light blue lines 2) black aged 15 in a dark blue hooded tracksuit
Non-Residential Burglary	TOOTING HIGH STREET	28/05/2005	2230	28/05/2005	2300	15 year old black male climbed onto roof, removed tiles and attempted to steal sportswear.
Non-Residential Burglary	BLACKSHAW ROAD	29/05/2005	0645	30/05/2005	0715	Burglar forced open a shutter and tried to steal from till
