



## Tooting Crime Briefing

4 November, 2004

Attached are details of the street crimes and burglaries reported to Tooting police between 29 September and 4 November, 2004

### STREET CRIME

Offence	Place	Date	Time	Method
Street Robbery	<b>BOLINGBROKE GROVE</b>	29/10/2004	0125	Suspect pulled victim on to common and searched him.
Street Robbery	<b>BALHAM HILL</b>	27/10/2004	2330	Suspect knocked victim to ground and stole property.
Street Robbery	<b>SOUTHCROFT ROAD</b>	28/10/2004	2015	By two black males, aged 20. One wore a blue/black hooded top and the other wore a jacket.
Street Robbery	<b>BEDFORD HILL</b>	29/10/2004	0115	Victim was apparently struck on the jaw, causing him to become unconscious, and his property stolen. No description of suspect.
Street Robbery	<b>BOLINGBROKE GROVE</b>	29/10/2004	0150	Suspects hit victim from behind, forced him to the ground and stole a travel card.
Street Robbery	<b>CLAIRVIEW ROAD</b>	29/10/2004	0100	Black male suspect, wearing blue jeans, approached victim from behind and stole property.
Street Robbery	<b>THRALE ROAD</b>	31/10/2004	0030	Suspect, black, male, aged 35, held down victim, searched his pockets and pushed him out of vehicle before driving off with victim's property.
Theft Snatch	<b>UPPER TOOTING PARK</b>	31/10/2004	2310	Suspect ran up behind victim and snatched bag. He was wearing a dark blue hooded jacket.

 Robbery **ROAD**

Three suspects, one with an automatic firearm, forcibly stole from victim. They were all male, aged 20, black, wearing black hooded tops. One also wore a black scarf.

## **ASSISTANCE**

**Victim Support** is an independent charity that helps people cope with crime.

Trained staff and volunteers, based in local branches, contact people after a crime has been committed, to offer free, confidential support and information.
