5 May, 2004

Attached are details of the street crimes and burglaries reported to Tooting police between 29th April and 5 May, 2004

STREET CRIME

Offence	Place	Date	Time	Method
Street Robbery	STREATHBOURNE ROAD	30/04/2004	1635	Victim was threatened by a white male, 17 yrs, dressed in a pale blue hooded top and baseball cap, and his phone was stolen.
Street Robbery	ALDERBROOK ROAD	01/05/2004	2155	30-year-old black male in black clothing and dark baseball cap pushed victim to ground, punched her in the head and stole her handbag.
Street Robbery	BALHAM GROVE	01/05/2004	2150	Suspect smashed car window with a wheel brace and then demanded property. The victim was then struck on the head with the wheel brace, causing injury. Suspect was male, black, in a dark, possibly multi-coloured, jumper, dark trousers and white trainers.
Theft Snatch	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	01/05/2004	1219	55-year-old Asian female snatched money from till and ran off.
Street Robbery	BLACKSHAW ROAD	02/05/2004	1959	24-year-old male suspect in black t-shirt and jeans threatened victim with a knife and a handgun and demanded money.
Commercial Robbery	MITCHAM ROAD	02/05/2004	1735	Two suspects entered shop and opened till. Female suspect then hit victim on head with iron bar, causing injury, and stole cash. 1) Female, 25 yrs, white, in pink jacket 2) 35 yrs, black, male, in black clothing with black hat.
Street Robbery	SELKIRK ROAD	02/05/2004	1600	By two suspect, both black, aged 20 and 25 yrs.



Street Robbery	COVERTON ROAD	04/05/2004 0730	Suspect aged 35 yrs, black, in fluorescent yellow jacket, grabbed victim as she was getting out of her car, causing her to fall to ground, then stole her handbag.

Residential Burglary	OLD DEVONSHIRE ROAD	28/04/2004	1530	28/04/2004	1640	Suspect forced door, breaking frame, and searched premises.
Residential Burglary	CATHLES ROAD	28/04/2004	2355	29/04/2004	0845	Suspect damaged glass panel in the front door in order to enter.
Residential Burglary	UPPER TOOTING ROAD	30/04/2004	1700			Three black male suspects aged about 20 yrs, entered building and caused damage.
Residential Burglary	LONGLEY ROAD	30/04/2004	1555	30/04/2004	1605	White male suspect, 20 yrs, thin face, dressed in white shirt and blue or black trousers called through intercom to flat asking to be let in to do repairs. Entry was refused, but he did manage to get into the building, although no property was taken.
Residential Burglary	RAVENSLEA ROAD	30/04/2004	2200	01/05/2004	1400	26 year old black female suspect stole TV and digital box.



Aggravated Burglary - Residential	BROXASH ROAD	30/04/2004 1300	30/04/2004 1302	Suspect forced the victim at knife point into her house, locking her in the kitchen. He then took her car keys and stole her car. He was black, 20 yrs, in black knitted hat, dark jacket and jeans.
Burglary - Residential	NIGHTINGALE LANE	30/04/2004 1300		
Residential Burglary	RAMSDEN ROAD	01/05/2004 0330		Burglar entered through open back door.
Residential Burglary	YUKON ROAD	01/05/2004 1000	02/05/2004 1400	Suspect entered house through front window, causing damage, and stole property.
Residential Burglary	RIBBLESDALE ROAD	02/05/2004 1200	03/05/2004 1930	Suspects entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	COWICK ROAD	03/05/2004 0200	03/05/2004 0225	16 year old white male in dirty grey t-shirt and dark tracksuit bottoms arrested in garden, intending to burgle premises.
