STREET CRIME

Offence	Street	Date	Time	Method
Theft Snatch	CATHLES ROAD	28/06/2005	1400	Two youths, aged 14 and 15, snatched phone from female victim.
Theft Snatch	RITHERDON ROAD	29/06/2005	2315	Thief on mountain bike snatched mobile phone from victim's hand. He was black, aged 20, wearing a brown baseball cap.
Theft Snatch	CHILLERTON ROAD	30/06/2005	1510	Two 16 year old black males snatched victim's mobile phone, which he was wearing on a cord around his neck. One was dressed in a white hooded sweatshirt, dark trousers and Nike trainers, and the other had a red hooded sweatshirt and dark trousers.
Street Robbery	WEST DRIVE	30/06/2005	2330	Two thieves demanded property then assaulted victims and stole property. 1) Male, aged 18, black, in a dark green jacket 2) male, aged 18, black, wearing a baseball cap.
Theft Snatch	SELKIRK ROAD	29/06/2005	1725	White female, aged 25, attempted to snatch victim's bag.

Non-Residential Burglary	ALDRINGTON ROAD	28/03/2005 1800 28/06/2005 1500	Thief broke door locks, entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	BALHAM PARK ROAD	27/06/2005 0900 27/06/2005 1745	Burglar entered flat and removed property.
Residential Burglary	BEDFORD HILL	27/06/2005 0915 27/06/2005 2200	Burglar entered through window, which had been left open, and stole property.
Residential Burglary	BYRNE ROAD	27/06/2005 0830 27/06/2005 1800	Burglar broke front window, entered and put door chain on, then stole property and left.
Residential Burglary	CUNLIFFE STREET	27/06/2005 0730 27/06/2005 2230	Intruder broke door open and entered.
Non-Residential Burglary	TRINITY CRESCENT	27/06/2005 0830 28/06/2005 0800	Thief broke padlocks from doors of several garages in order to enter.
Residential Burglary	BEDFORD HILL	29/06/2005 1000 29/06/2005 1100	Burglar forced entry and removed goods.
Residential Burglary	CARMINIA ROAD	29/06/2005 0900	Intruder stole property from victim's room.
Residential Burglary	MITCHAM LANE	29/06/2005 1400 29/06/2005 2300	Thief forced door to flat, entered and removed property.
Residential Burglary	YUKON ROAD	29/06/2005 1200 30/06/2005 0400	Intruder entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	MELLISON ROAD	30/06/2005 0900 30/06/2005 2010	Burglar entered rear garden then smashed two panes of glass in the rear door in an attempt to gain entry.
Aggravated Burglary - Residential	KETTERING STREET	01/07/2005 0220 01/07/2005 0230	Two black males, both aged 18, and wearing dark hooded clothing, entered, threatened victims with a handgun and stole property.
Non-Residential Burglary	GARRATT LANE	01/07/2005 1700 04/07/2005 1000	Intruder entered and attempted to steal.



Residential Burglary **RAMSDEN ROAD** 02/07/2005 1230 02/07/2005 1400 Burglar forced communal door and flat doors and then stole property.

Residential Burglary **BEEHCROFT ROAD** 03/07/2005 0700 03/07/2005 1100 Burglar attempted to enter by forcing rear door.

Non-Residential Burglary **MITCHAM ROAD** 04/07/2005 1850 Thief posed as site worker then forced door off tool store. He was white, aged 35, in a blue tracksuit, white trainers and a high visibility jacket.

Residential Burglary **FERNLEA ROAD** 04/07/2005 1000 04/07/2005 1600 Thief entered flat through rear bedroom window.
