Theft Snatch	<b>TOOTING BROADWAY</b>	02/07/2004	1600	Bag snatched by black male in a light blue hooded top and white trainers.
Theft Snatch	<b>UPPER TOOTING ROAD</b>	02/07/2004	2330	Three male took victim's suitcase from behind. Two were black wearing dark hooded tops; the other was white.
Street Robbery	<b>JAGGARD WAY</b>	05/07/2004	1315	As victims left station they were forced onto common and threatened by four youths who demanded their money and phones. 1) 16 yrs, white, in cream jacket and blue jeans, with Nike trainers 2) 16 yrs, white, in cream jacket dark jeans and trainers 3) 16 yrs, black, in blue leather jacket, black jeans hat and trainers 4) 16 yrs, black, in blue waterproof jacket, blue jeans and trainers.
Theft Snatch	<b>TOOTING HIGH STREET</b>	05/07/2004	1210	22 year old black male in black t-shirt and jeans and with a thick chain around his neck, took phone from victim's hand.
Street Robbery	<b>BALHAM HIGH RD</b>	06/07/2004	2215	Victim followed and surrounded by 16 year old black male suspects.

Residential Burglary	<b>NIGHTINGALE LANE</b>	02/07/2004 1330	02/07/2004 1710	Suspect climbed on to flat roof and entered through open kitchen window, then stole property.
Residential Burglary	<b>NIGHTINGALE LANE</b>	02/07/2004 2030	03/07/2004 0130	Suspect broke in through bedroom window and stole. He was black, with a red sports top.
Non-Residential Burglary	<b>MITCHAM LANE</b>	03/07/2004 2000	04/07/2004 1000	Doors to communal area wedged open allowing suspect to enter and force window. He was a black male wearing a grey hooded top.
Residential Burglary	<b>NIGHTINGALE LANE</b>	03/07/2004 2100	03/07/2004 2145	Suspect entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	<b>STREATHBOURNE ROAD</b>	03/07/2004 1830	04/07/2004 0830	Suspect entered after breaking a large glass window, then stole computers.
Residential Burglary	<b>FRANCISCAN ROAD</b>	04/07/2004 2245	04/07/2004 2255	Suspect entered and stole.



Residential Burglary	<b>SUDBROOKE ROAD</b>	05/07/2004 0930	05/07/2004 1550	Suspect cut padlock from garage door and stole pedal cycle.
Residential Burglary	<b>NIGHTINGALE LANE</b>	05/07/2004 0800	05/07/2004 1845	Suspect forced entry firstly into communal area serving two flats then forced entry into one of the two flats and stole a pedal cycle
Residential Burglary	<b>RAVENSWOOD ROAD</b>	05/07/2004 2000	06/07/2004 0830	Thief stole property from communal hallway.
Residential Burglary	<b>GRAVENEY ROAD</b>	06/07/2004 1400	06/07/2004 2200	Burglar entered building and stole from bedroom.
Residential Burglary	<b>TOTTERDOWN STREET</b>	06/07/2004 1030	06/07/2004 1130	Suspect opened front ground floor window and stole cash from living room.
