9 June, 2004

Attached are details of the street crimes and burglaries reported to Tooting police between 3 June and 9 June, 2004

STREET CRIME

Offence	Place	Date	Time	Method
Street Robbery	BROOMWOOD ROAD	06/06/2004	2300	Black suspect stabbed victim in the back in an attempt to rob her of her handbag.
Theft Snatch	BALHAM HGH ROAD	04/06/2004	1820	Victim was counting cash when suspect asked for toilet. When refused he appeared to be about to steal cash, and police were called. He then left.
Street Robbery	BEDFORD HILL	02/06/2004	2300	Black male snatched victim's handbag. He was wearing a black, red and white hooded top, black baseball cap, black baggy trousers and black trainers.
Theft Snatch	ESWYN ROAD	07/06/2004	0100	18-year-old black male in dark clothing took victim's property from her hand.
Street Robbery	FURZEDOWN DRIVE	07/06/2004	1617	Three suspects demanded money then hit victim in face. 1) 10 yrs, black, male, wearing a jumper 2) 15 yrs, black, male wearing a grey hooded top 3) 16 yrs, black, male, wearing a long sleeved hooded top.



Street Robbery	MITCHAM LANE	07/06/2004	2210	Group of about eight suspects surrounded victim, threatened him with a large black-handled knife and stole property. They were all black aged about 22, and wore sports clothing.
Commercial Robbery	NIGHTINGALE LANE	04/06/2004	2155	Three male suspects, all black, wearing dark hooded tops, pushed victim to floor at rear of store and forced her to open the till. They then stole cash.
Theft Snatch	NOTTINGHAM ROAD	06/06/2004	1410	Female suspect, 15 yrs, white, in black tracksuit trousers snatched victim's shoulder bag.
Theft Snatch	NOTTINGHAM ROAD	06/06/2004	1410	15-year-old white boy, on a bike, snatched victim's shoulder bag. He was wearing a blue jumper.
Street Robbery	TRINITY ROAD	07/06/2004	1650	Three white male suspects, aged 15, demanded money, and then punched victim. One wore a blue and white top and another had a white t-shirt.
Theft Snatch	UPPER TOOTING ROAD	02/06/2004	2125	18-year-old black male suspect, dressed in dark clothing and dark hat, attempted to snatch victim's handbag.

Residential Burglary	RITHERDON ROAD	09/06/2004	0200	09/06/2004	0230	Suspect(s) entered location and took property
Residential Burglary	STATION PARADE BALHAM HIGH ROAD	07/06/2004	0830	07/06/2004	1900	Suspects climbed through flat roof to third floor window entered and stole a flat
Residential Burglary	BALHAM HILL	05/06/2004	1000	06/06/2004	1700	Suspect kicked open flat doors and took items.
Residential Burglary	BALHAM HILL	05/06/2004	1000	06/06/2004	1830	Door kicked open by burglar who then searched premises.
Non-Residential Burglary	BELLVUE PARADE, WISETON ROAD	05/06/2004	1420			Suspect entered rear of shop through open door, and was disturbed whilst searching for property. He was 30, black, in a blue-grey striped top.
Residential Burglary	CALBOURNE ROAD	04/06/2004	1740	04/06/2004	1800	Two bicycles stolen from garage.
Burglary Artifice - Residential	COLWYN CLOSE	01/06/2004	1200	01/06/2004	1245	45-year-old white man in blue t-shirt and blue jeans entered after claiming that he need to inspect radiators and boiler.
Non-Residential Burglary	CRANMER TERRACE	04/06/2004	2200	07/06/2004	0700	Two burglars, one male, one female, climbed on to flat roof, then entered through insecure window and stole and damaged property.
Residential Burglary	ELMFIELD ROAD	05/06/2004	1100	05/06/2004	1200	Suspect entered through rear of premises and stole.
Non-Residential Burglary	GREAVES PLACE	03/06/2004	2315	04/06/2004	0640	Thief forced entry through fire exit, then damaged and stole property.



Residential Burglary	KENLOR ROAD	06/06/2004	1455	06/06/2004	1518	Group of six suspects forced victim back from front door, held him down and punched him repeatedly, then stole property. One was female, white, aged 24, two were male, black aged 30-32, and the others were white, aged 29-33.
Residential Burglary	LONGLEY ROAD	04/06/2004	0230	04/06/2004	1100	Intruder entered after smashing patio door.
Residential Burglary	MITCHAM ROAD	05/06/2004	1700	05/06/2004	2300	Suspect climbed onto flat roof and stole property after entering through insecure window.
Residential Burglary	NIGHTINGALE LANE	05/06/2004	0955			25-year-old black man wearing shiny green anorak, broke bottom of door and stole property.
Residential Burglary	OLD DEVONSHIRE ROAD	28/05/2004	0300	06/06/2004	1800	Suspect entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	TEMPERLEY ROAD	06/06/2004	1930	06/06/2004	2020	Suspect broke front window and stole property.
Residential Burglary	WISETON ROAD	01/06/2004	2300	02/06/2004	0750	Intruder entered and stole.
