Street Robbery BALHAM HIGH ROAD	09/11/2004	1630	Three suspects threatened victim with a knife and demanded money. 1) 16 yrs, male, black, in a black blazer and white shirt 2) 16 yrs, black, male, in black blazer and black woollen hat 3) 16 yrs, male, black, in blue hooded top and riding a blue bicycle.
Street Robbery BOLINGBROKE GROVE	02/11/2004	1700	Victim was stopped by three suspects who asked to ride his bike. When refused they shouted at victim causing the victim to fear that he would be assaulted if he did not hand bike over. 1) Male, white, 16 yrs, in a blue hooded top 2) 11 yrs, male, white, in a grey hooded top 3) male, white, in a black hooded top.
Theft Snatch GLENBURNIE ROAD	08/11/2004	0950	Mobile phone and cash taken from the victim by a 32 year old white woman.
Street Robbery TOOTING HIGH STREET	06/11/2004	0130	As victim was using her mobile phone a 15 year old black male, wearing a dark hooded top, pulled her hair from behind and stole her phone.
Theft Snatch ULLATHORNE ROAD	02/11/2004	1005	Suspect in blue jacket, riding a motorcycle, snatched laptop from victim.
Theft Snatch UPPER TOOTING ROAD	26/10/2004	0100	Suspect snatched victim's property.

Non-Residential Burglary	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	05/11/2004	2030	08/11/2004	0830 Suspect used ladder to reach window, levered it open and entered. He then broke an internal door and lock and stole electrical equipment and cash.
Non-Residential Burglary	OLD DEVONSHIRE ROAD	09/11/2004	0043		White male, wearing red, white and blue jacket with writing on, attempted to enter premises.
Residential Burglary	DINSMORE ROAD	01/11/2004	0715	01/11/2004	1330 Suspect slipping latch on communal front door, entered flat after slipping latch, and stole cash.
Residential Burglary	OAKMEAD ROAD	02/11/2004	0930	02/11/2004	2100 Suspect entered and stole.



Residential Burglary	BALHAM PARK ROAD	04/11/2004 2300	05/11/2004 0130	Burglar broke open side door, entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	DAFFORNE ROAD	04/11/2004 1900	05/11/2004 0300	Burglar entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	THRALE ROAD	04/11/2004 1630	05/11/2004 1330	Suspect forced entry to recently refurbished house and stole new boiler.
Residential Burglary	BICKERSTETH ROAD	05/11/2004 1900	06/11/2004 1000	Thief forced open side door of garage.
Residential Burglary	UPPER TOOTING ROAD	06/11/2004 1330	06/11/2004 2000	Burglar entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	ROGERS ROAD	07/11/2004 1700	08/11/2004 0700	Intruder broke through double glazed door on side of garage and then forced an internal utility door to gain access to house.
Residential Burglary	LONGLEY ROAD	08/11/2004 0730	08/11/2004 2115	Suspect slipped latch on front door, entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	BROADWATER ROAD	10/11/2004 0730	10/11/2004 1830	Burglar broke in and stole.
Residential Burglary	EARDLEY ROAD	10/11/2004 0800	10/11/2004 1900	Suspect forced flat door with tool, entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	BESLEY STREET	10/11/2004 1415	10/11/2004 1437	Suspect forced entry into house and then damaged property. He was black, aged about 33.
Residential Burglary	MITCHAM LANE	10/11/2004 1745	10/11/2004 1750	Suspect climbed onto house extension and was seen to force window open with a metal bar. He was aged about 45.

Crimes can also be reported online, through www.online.police.uk/ This is only for non-urgent crimes, where an immediate police response is not required.

ASSISTANCE

Victim Support Wandsworth, tel. 0207 223 1234, is an independent charity that helps people cope with crime.

Trained staff and volunteers, based in local branches, contact people after a crime has been committed, to offer free, confidential support and information. The Police and other organisations refer victims of crime to Victim Support; however some people feel able to 'pop in' to one of our branches to ask for assistance.

Age Concern Wandsworth, tel. 0208 870 2020 can also offer advice and assistance to the over-50s, whether or not you have been a victim of crime. You can also report a crime and get advice at the Age Concern **Safe & Secure Advice Desk**, each Thursday from 10am to 1pm, where you can speak to a police Crime Prevention Officer, Victim Support worker or a Community Safety Officer.
