### STREET CRIME

Theft Snatch	BARRINGER SQUARE	11/05/2004	1645	Victim's phone was snatched from his whilst he was in his car.
Street Robbery	CHURCH LANE	11/05/2004	2150	Five suspects knocked victim to ground, threatened him with knives and demanded mobile phone. 1) Male, 20 yrs, black, in navy jumper with "USA" on back, grey & black woollen hat and blue & white trainers 2) male, 21 yrs, black, in dark blue denim suit, sovereign rings on right hand and black trainers 3) male, black, 21 yrs, in grey/white tracksuit and gold sovereign rings on each finger 4) male, white, 22 yrs, in black vest, 3/4 length tracksuit and trainers 5) male, black, 23 yrs, in black and white jacket with picture of Snoopy.
Street Robbery	TOOTING BEC ROAD	11/05/2004	1330	Suspect punched victim and stole his watch
Theft Snatch	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	06/05/2004	2200	As victim was eating in restaurant suspect stole her bag from the table. He was 16 yrs, black, in a dark blue cap, pale blue hooded top with a number on, jeans and trainers.
Street Robbery	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	09/05/2004	0400	Two black men aged about 20 threatened victim and stole property.



Street Robbery	BELLEVUE ROAD	07/05/2004 2155	Two suspects threatened victim and demanded money. Both were male, black, 17 yrs, one in a black hooded jacket; the other wore a grey hooded tracksuit top and grey trousers.
Street Robbery	FERNTHORPE ROAD	06/05/2004 1009	Two suspects threatened victim with machete and demanded cash from till, etc. 1) 16 yrs, white, in dark top and trousers 2) 16 yrs, black, also in dark top and trousers.
Commercial Robbery	HILDRETH STREET	04/05/2004 1600	Black male, 35 yrs, in long purple jacket and dark trousers, entered commercial premises and produced a firearm. He then stole property.
Theft Snatch	LONGLEY ROAD	10/05/2004 1400	Victim was counting money in the street when it was stolen by a black man, 25 yrs, wearing a light blue denim jacket.
Street Robbery	MITCHAM LANE	07/05/2004 2145	Victim was attacked by four female suspects, all black, one wearing a light coloured hooded top and with her hair tied back.
Street Robbery	TOTTERDOWN STREET	07/05/2004 2200	Two 27-year-old Asian men pushed victim and stole her mobile phone. One wore white clothing, and the other had a bright blue denim jacket with faded patches and blue denim jeans. Both left in a car.
Street Robbery	UPPER TOOTING ROAD	06/05/2004 1202	Suspect, 28 yrs, male, in white baseball cap, and dark, stained, top, stole victim's phone and jacket containing large amount of cash.
Street Robbery	UPPER TOOTING ROAD	06/05/2004 1400	The two male suspects held the victim as he was trying to withdraw some money from a cash machine. Whilst they held him, the female took his card from the machine. 1) Female, 35 yrs, in full length Muslim dress 2) white skinhead, 25 yrs, in red and white shirt and brown trousers 3) 40 yrs, male, white, with beard, brown hair, yellow shirt, tan jacket and blue jeans.

Residential Burglary	BRENDA ROAD	09/05/2004	0200	09/05/2004	1130	Burglar entered and stole.
Non-Residential Burglary	BRODRICK ROAD	08/05/2004	1330			Suspect opened shed and stole bike.



Non-Residential Burglary	CRANMER TERRACE	08/05/2004	1530	08/05/2004	2030	Suspects forced entry to five offices and stole computers, removing them on a trolley after putting them in black bin liners.
Residential Burglary	ENDLESHAM ROAD	07/05/2004	1100	07/05/2004	1640	Suspect gained entry to communal parts of hostel then attempted to force door of flat.
Residential Burglary	FAYLAND AVENUE	05/05/2004	0100	05/05/2004	0700	Suspect attempted to enter by smashing window and lifting window handle, but unable to get in.
Residential Burglary	FERNTHORPE ROAD	07/05/2004	0800	07/05/2004	1800	Suspect broke rear kitchen window with a brick, entered and stole
Residential Burglary	LONGLEY ROAD	08/05/2004	0415	08/05/2004	0435	White male, 30, attempted to open back door whilst victim slept.
Residential Burglary	MARIUS ROAD	10/05/2004	1230	10/05/2004	1530	Burglar entered and stole laptop.
Residential Burglary	THURLEIGH ROAD	04/05/2004	2245	05/05/2004	0545	Suspect entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	UPPER TOOTING ROAD	07/05/2004	1400			Suspect, 28 yrs, in red, white and black leather jacket entered flat by unknown means. When confronted claimed to be a door-to-door salesman.
