Street Robbery	BALHAM HILL	12/07/2004	1800	The victim was punched in the face by suspect, who then ordered him to hand over property. Suspect was black, male, wearing a white t-shirt and black trousers.
Street Robbery	EATONVILLE VILLAS	13/07/2004	1750	Five suspects surrounded victim, demanded property, then pushed him to the ground and stole his pedal cycle. All were black, aged 15-16, male, ; one wore a baseball cap with "N" emblem and diamond earrings; another had Avirex trousers, a Nike hooded top, and red /grey baseball cap.
Street Robbery	UPPER TOOTING ROAD	13/07/2004	1500	Three Asian youths, aged about 18, punched victim in eye and stole mobile phone. 1) Skinny 2) Dark-skinned, wearing dark blue t-shirt and blue tracksuit bottoms 3) Spotty face, fair skin, in white t-shirt, baseball cap and blue jeans.
Street Robbery	WANDSWORTH COMMON	09/07/2004	2130	One suspect held victim in headlock, whilst the other stole items from other victims. 1) Male, black, 22 yrs, in white hooded sweatshirt, dark jeans and baseball cap 2) Male, black, 24 yrs, in grey hooded top, black woolly hat and grey trousers.
Theft Snatch	CHURCH LANE	05/07/2004	1930	The victim was forced to hand over his mobile phone by a black male, 17 yrs.
Theft Snatch	ENDLESHAM ROAD	09/07/2004	1715	14 year old black male suspect asked victim for money. When it was refused the suspect threatened victim with a weapon.

Residential Burglary	VANT ROAD	08/07/2004 1300	Thief smashed a front window, entered and stole property.

Non-Residential Burglary	MITCHAM LANE	07/07/2004 1700	Black male suspect, 22 yrs, entered locked hostel room using a key, and stole property..
Non-Residential Burglary	MITCHAM ROAD	07/07/2004 2200	Suspect broke glass in lower part of door and stole computers and other electrical goods.
Non-Residential Burglary	CRANMER TERRACE	08/07/2004 2030	Suspect entered locked office and stole computer equipment.
Non-Residential Burglary	CULVERDEN ROAD	08/07/2004 2300	Suspect kicking back gate open and then entered a garden shed.
Non-Residential Burglary	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	10/07/2004 2230	
Non-Residential Burglary	BALHAM HILL	11/07/2004 1600	Two suspects used wire coat hanger through letterbox to steal keys. Both were male, white; one was about 40 and the other about 38.
Non-Residential Burglary	HILDRETH STREET	12/07/2004 1130	Suspect stole from garage of store, left open by owner as he loaded goods.
Residential Burglary	LAUREL CLOSE	07/07/2004 1450	As victim lay in bed a 25 year old white male entered and took the purse from her handbag. When she challenged him he pushed her back onto bed and left. He wore dark trousers and a green t-shirt and had shaven blond hair.



Residential Burglary	BEVILL ALLEN CLOSE 08/07/2004 0400	Black male suspect, aged about 39, entered and stole property. He was wearing dark green jeans, a dark jacket and trainers.
