Attached are details of the street crimes and burglaries reported to Tooting police between 7 October and 14 October, 2004

STREET CRIME

Offence	Place	Date	Time	Method
Street Robbery	KHARTOUM ROAD	3/10/2004	0430	Suspect pushed victim to ground and stole wallet from his pocket.
Street Robbery	RAMSDEN ROAD	07/10/2004	1605	Two suspects searched victim and stole his mobile phone. Both were black males, aged 17; one wore a black Nike hooded top and black woollen hat, and was riding a yellow mountain bike.
Theft Snatch	RITHERDON ROAD	07/10/2004	1325	Two suspects on mountain bikes snatched victim's shoulder bag. 1) Male, black, 20 yrs, in a black jacket and blue jeans 2) male, black, 20 yrs, in black jacket and blue jeans.
Street Robbery	MALWOOD ROAD	08/10/2004	1530	19 year old black male held victim around neck and stole a gold chain. He was wearing a grey hooded top and blue jeans.
Street Robbery	MITCHAM ROAD	08/10/2004	1600	Group of suspects held victim in his seat on a bus and stole property. One was male, 16 yrs, black, in a blue tracksuit and blue woollen hat.
Street Robbery	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	08/10/2004	1600	Three black male suspects pushed victim to ground, threatened him with knives and stole a mobile phone.
Street Robbery	TOOTING BEC COMMON	08/10/2004	1930	By black male in hooded top.



Street Robbery	CARLISLE WAY	09/10/2004 2352	Suspect hit victim from behind, causing swelling to her eye and a cut on her head, then stole her mobile phone. He was black, male, 25 yrs, in a dark top and cream baseball cap.
Street Robbery	TOPSHAM ROAD	10/10/2004 0130	30 year old black male grabbed victim, threatened him and demanded his mobile phone. He was wearing black jeans and a grey hooded top.
Street Robbery	SMALLWOOD ROAD	11/10/2004 1615	Suspect attempted to steal mobile phone, which was connected to a cord around victim's neck.
Street Robbery	ALDRINGTON ROAD	11/10/2004 1700	Suspect threatened victim with a handgun and stole a mobile phone. He was white, aged 31, wearing a blue baseball cap, cream jacket and denim jeans, and carried a bottle of Stella lager.
Street Robbery	BALHAM HILL	12/10/2004 1905	Three suspects grabbed victim around throat, pushed him to the ground and attempted to steal laptop and bag. 1) Male, white, 13 yrs, in a blue hooded top 2) 13 yrs, white, male, wearing a blue hooded top and blue tracksuit trousers with white writing 3) 20 yrs, male, black, wearing a blue hooded top.

Non-Residential Burglary	BLACKSHAW ROAD	08/10/2004	0345			Thief entered and opened cupboards before being stopped by staff member. He was aged 26, white, in a dark top, black jogging trousers and white Reebok trainers.
Residential Burglary	STAPLETON ROAD	08/10/2004	0915	08/10/2004	1600	Suspect broke in and stole items.
Residential Burglary	WHEATLANDS ROAD	8/10/2004	0830	8/10/2004	1000	Burglar entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	HAWTHORNE CRESCENT, CHURCH LANE	8/10/2004	1200	11/10/2004	1200	Intruder forced window lock, entered and stole property.
Residential Burglary	HOLMSIDE ROAD	09/10/2004	1800			Suspect entered premises and stole property.
Residential Burglary	SUDBROOKE ROAD	09/10/2004	0005	09/10/2004	1000	Suspect gained access through a open window and stole property.

Non-Residential Burglary		10/10/20041300	10/10/20041300	Suspect broke in to garage and stole property.

Residential Burglary	SELLINCOURT ROAD	11/10/20041329		Two suspects entered, but were disturbed and left. 1) Female, white, in a dark puffa jacket 2) male, black, 32 yrs, in brown jacket and dark woollen hat.
Residential Burglary	BLACKSHAW ROAD	11/10/20042200		Suspect broke in through a window and stole tools.
Residential Burglary	COVERTON ROAD	11/10/20041400	11/10/20042359	Burglar entered communal hallway, which had been left insecure, and forced open door of ground floor flat with bodily pressure, then stole property.
Residential Burglary	NIGHTINGALE LANE	11/10/20041450	11/10/20041455	Two 18 year old male suspects attempted to slip lock to front door of flat before being disturbed by occupier. One was white, wearing a blue t-shirt with a logo on the front and stone washed jeans.
Burglary Artifice - Residential	TOOTING BEC ROAD	12/10/20041500	12/10/20041512	Male suspect followed elderly female upstairs to her flat, said he was from the council and asked to come in and check the quality of the drinking water. He was allowed entry but her husband demanded to see his identification, and he left, but stole handbag.



Non-Residential Burglary	CRANMER TERRACE	12/10/2004 1800	13/10/2004 0700	Thief entered communal area from rear then broke into flats, stealing two computers and two drills.
Residential Burglary	MOIRA COURT	12/10/2004 0830	12/10/2004 1845	Suspect broke in and stole property.
Residential Burglary	FERNLEA ROAD	13/10/2004 0830	13/10/2004 2110	Thief broke open door and searched premises.
Residential Burglary	OLD HOSPITAL CLOSE	14/10/2004 0015	14/10/2004 0030	30 year old black male, wearing a blue denim jacket, broke in and stole.
