Attached are details of the street crimes and burglaries reported to Tooting police between 10 June and 16 June, 2004

STREET CRIME

Offence	Place	Date	Time	Method
Theft Snatch	BALHAM PARK ROAD	09/06/2004	1639	Three 16-year-old black youths stopped victim and asked him for money. 1) Wearing white t-shirt 2) wearing white shirt 3) in blue Nike hooded top and bandana
Theft Snatch	CHURCH LANE	09/06/2004	2200	As victim was using his mobile phone suspect on a bicycle, who approached from behind, snatched it from him.
Street Robbery	GARRATT LANE	09/06/2004	2155	Three 17-year-old suspects held victim around neck, searched him and stole property. One wore a blue Adidas tracksuit top, another had a red hooded top and the third wore a black baseball cap.
Theft Snatch	RITHERDON ROAD	09/06/2004	1700	48-year-old black male in red t-shirt and jeans, stole bag from front seat of car. The victim followed him and took it back.
Street Robbery	TOOTING BEC ROAD	09/06/2004	1645	Two black 15 year-old males offered victim drugs. When he refused they kicked him and demanded money.
Street Robbery	FERNLEA ROAD	10/06/2004	1145	Three suspects held victim from behind and stole a camcorder. They were all aged 18-20, black, male, in dark hooded tops, possibly wearing jeans.
Commercial Robbery	MOYSER ROAD	10/06/2004	2145	Black suspect in a dark hooded top tried to snatch money from till. When he was prevented by victim he hit him with a cosh.
Street Robbery	TOOTING BEC ROAD	10/06/2004	1830	Four white 17-year-old male suspects hit victim in throat and stole his bicycle.
Street Robbery	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	11/06/2004	2130	Three suspects entered pub, asking for directions, and stole mobile phone from handbag.



Street Robbery	BELLEVUE ROAD	11/06/2004 2315	Suspect used violence and stole property.
Street Robbery	TOOTING BROADWAY	11/06/2004 1655	Three 15 year old black girls pushed and pulled victim and demanded money. One wore a grey school jumper, blue or black skirt and flat black shoes; another had a white school blouse, black or blue skirt and flat black shoes.
Street Robbery	TOOTING BROADWAY	12/06/2004 1130	Victim threatened with violence by 16-year-old black youth, and 17-year-old black youth in yellow Arsenal football shirt.

Residential Burglary	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	10/06/2004 1400	10/06/2004 2100	Suspect forced bed sit door and removed property
Aggravated Burglary - Residential	CAVENDISH ROAD	10/06/2004 0100		Suspect broke in, slashed victim's nose with a knife and then stole property. He was male, black, 22 yrs, wearing a navy hooded jumper with writing on, dark tracksuit trousers and trainers with a red sole.
Non-Residential Burglary	CRANMER TERRACE	10/06/2004 0245		Suspects caught inside premises, having entered with the intention of stealing.
Non-Residential Burglary	MITCHAM LANE	10/06/2004 1720	10/06/2004 1725	Suspects disturbed whilst using tool to break window. He was 20, male, wearing a dark top.
Residential Burglary	TRINITY ROAD	10/06/2004 1650		Suspect entered property and stole property.
Non-Residential Burglary	GREAVES PLACE	11/06/2004 2300	12/06/2004 0300	Thief entered building, damaged property and stole cash from vending machines
Residential Burglary	BRODRICK ROAD	12/06/2004 2230	13/06/2004 0900	Suspects entered property and stole property.
Residential Burglary	PARKLANDS ROAD	12/06/2004 2300	13/06/2004 0730	Suspect entered through rear door and stole items from table



Non-Residential Burglary	MITCHAM LANE	13/06/20040148		Three suspects broke in and stole property. 1) Male, black, 16, in a black baseball cap, black hooded top, red t-shirt, black trousers and trainers 2) Male, black, 17, in black hooded Nike top and blue jeans 3) Male, white, 19, in grey hooded tracksuit and white trainers.
Residential Burglary	RAMSDEN ROAD	13/06/20041100	13/06/20041500	Suspects walked in through open front door and took laptop computer from front room
Residential Burglary	CATHLES ROAD	14/06/20042340	15/06/20040005	Suspect forced window, reached in and took property.
