17 February, 2005

Attached are details of the street crimes and burglaries reported to Tooting police between 10 February and 17 February, 2005

STREET CRIME

Offence	Street	Date	Time	Method
Commercial Robbery	THRALE ROAD	09-Feb-05	1220	Three suspects went behind shop counter and when an assistant tried to stop them she was pushed and fell to the floor. 1) Male, black, aged 18, in a blue and white hooded top 2) male, aged 18, black, in a grey hooded top 3) male, black, aged 18.
Commercial Robbery	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	16/2/2005	1615	Suspects entered shop; one went behind the counter and took a phone whilst the other reached behind the counter stole three phones from the display.
Street Robbery	BEDFORD HILL	13/02/2005	1810	Two black male suspects knocked victim to the ground and stole his rucksack. One was aged 28, smart appearance, wearing a roll neck top and a black jacket.
Street Robbery	PARKLANDS ROAD	14/02/2005	1840	Two suspects threatened victim, punched him in face and searched him.
Street Robbery	ROWFANT ROAD	11-Feb-05	2320	Two suspects stole victim's property as she was about to enter her home. One was a white female, and the other was a black male, aged about 20.
Street Robbery	WELHAM ROAD	10-Feb-05	1530	Two suspects pushed victim against a wall and demanded money. When he refused they pushed him again. 1) Male, aged 11, white, in Graveney school uniform 2) male, white, aged 13, in Graveney school uniform.



Street Robbery	FRANSISCAN ROAD	09-Feb-05	0730	Two 15 year old black male suspects demanded property, and then stole victim's mobile phone from his pocket. One wore a dark grey cap and black trainers and the other had a blue Nike tracksuit and white trainers.
Street Robbery	FALLSBROOK ROAD	15/02/2005	1915	16 year old black male, dressed in black clothing, pushed victim to the ground from behind and stole his wallet from his jacket pocket.
Street Robbery	LEACROFT AVENUE	15/02/2005	0708	Suspect pushed victim against a brick wall, threatened him with a red-handled knife and asked him to empty his pockets. He was wearing a black puffa jacket, blue jeans, white Nike trainers and a black woollen hat.
Street Robbery	RUSHAM ROAD	11-Feb-05	0950	Female suspect used force to take money from the victim causing injury to her hand. She was aged 11, black, in a dark blue jumper and navy running trousers.
Theft Snatch	ANSELL ROAD	13-Feb-05	1920	By male, suspect, black, aged 25, dressed in jeans, white trainers, grey top.
Theft Snatch	MITCHAM ROAD	10-Feb-05	1900	Thief snatched victim's phone as he was using it.

Residential Burglary	TRINITY ROAD	12-Feb-05	0001	13-Feb-05	2359	Intruder entered flat and took property.



Non-Residential Burglary	MACMILLAN WAY	11-Feb-05	2100	14-Feb-05	0700	Burglar entered after forcing fire exit door.
Non-Residential Burglary	MITCHAM LANE	12-Feb-05	1800	13-Feb-05	1800	Intruder entered and took property.
Non-Residential Burglary	SHIPKA ROAD	8-Feb-05	2000	10-Feb-05	2300	Suspect entered and removed items.
Non-Residential Burglary	SMALLWOOD ROAD	12-Feb-05	2000	13-Feb-05	0700	Burglar smashed window, reached inside and stole property.
Non-Residential Burglary	TOOTING HIGH STREET	16/2/2005	1130	16/2/2005	1200	Burglar gained access to shop premises, forced entry to the manager's office and stole money from the safe and personal property.
Non-Residential Burglary	UPPER TOOTING ROAD	9-Feb-05	1830	10-Feb-05	0900	Suspect forced open a window entered premises and stole property
Residential Burglary	EDENCOURT ROAD	12-Feb-05	0930	12-Feb-05	1000	Burglar forced entry through glass panel in door. He was black, aged 29, wearing a black jacket and light combat trousers.
Residential Burglary	PENDLE ROAD	1-Oct-04	0001	1-Jan-05	0001	52 year old white male forced window of flat, entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	UNDINE STREET	10-Feb-05	0115			Burglar entered victim's house when she left door open to go to her vehicle. He was aged 25, black, in a thick cotton bomber jacket, jeans and baseball cap.
Residential Burglary	UPPER TOOTING PARK	11-Feb-05	1100	11-Feb-05	1230	Burglar used keys in attempt to enter. He was white, aged 55, in blue tracksuit trousers, red t-shirt and blue top, and was carrying a grey courier's bag over his shoulder.



Residential Burglary	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	16/2/2005	0900	16/2/2005	1000	Burglar entered through unlocked communal door, then forced front door of flat.
Residential Burglary	CHILLERTON ROAD	9-Feb-05	0915	9-Feb-05	1600	Suspect entered after releasing latch using an instrument through the letterbox.
Residential Burglary	DAFFORNE ROAD	9-Feb-05	1900			Communal door forced, but internal doors left intact.
Residential Burglary	DAHOMEY ROAD	12-Feb-05	1400	12-Feb-05	2100	Suspect broke in and stole.
Residential Burglary	HESLOP ROAD	15/02/2005	0800	15/02/2005	1900	Suspect forced entry and stole property.
Residential Burglary	HILLBROOK ROAD	28-Jan-05	1000	12-Feb-05	2100	Thief broke glass in front door, entered and damaged property, then stole.
Residential Burglary	HOSACK ROAD	29-Jan-05	1200	8-Feb-05	1616	Suspect broke in through first floor toilet window.
Residential Burglary	MITCHAM ROAD	4-Feb-05	2200	5-Feb-05	1600	Suspect entered and took cash.
Residential Burglary	NEVIS ROAD	9-Feb-05	0700	9-Feb-05	2335	Burglar reached in and used back door key to unlock key and enter, then stole property.
Residential Burglary	ROMBERG ROAD	9-Feb-05	0825	9-Feb-05	1400	Suspect slipped latch on communal front door, the forced open door to flat and stole property.
Residential Burglary	ROMBERG ROAD	9-Feb-05	0930	9-Feb-05	1245	Suspect forced door, breaking both locks, and stole property.
Residential Burglary	ROMBERG ROAD	9-Feb-05	1630	9-Feb-05	2000	Both the front door to the building and flat were forced by suspect who stole laptop.
Residential Burglary	ROMBERG ROAD	9-Feb-05	1630	9-Feb-05	2000	Suspect entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	ROMBERG ROAD	9-Feb-05	1308			Suspects attempted to gain entry, causing damage to door.
