



## Tooting Crime Briefing

17 March, 2005

Attached are details of the street crimes and burglaries reported to Tooting police between 10 March and 17 March, 2005

### STREET CRIME

Offence	Street	Date	Time	Method
Theft Snatch	<b>TOOTING BEC ROAD</b>	11/3/2005	1315	As victim was using his mobile phone it was snatched by two suspects 1) Male, black, aged 26, in a navy hooded top 2) male, white, aged 25.
Theft Snatch	<b>EASTBOURNE ROAD</b>	11/3/2005	1200	25 year old Asian male snatched victim's handbag.
Commercial Robbery	<b>MOYSER ROAD</b>	12/3/2005	1558	Suspect threatened victim with a knife, forced victim to open till and stole cash from it. He was black, aged 35, in a large black hooded jacket and gloves.
Street Robbery	<b>BEDFORD HILL</b>	10/3/2005	2330	By a 25 year old black suspect, wearing a light blue tracksuit top and a black cap.
Street Robbery	<b>BALHAM PARK ROAD</b>	13/3/2005	0350	Two suspects kicked and threatened victim and forced him to withdraw money from a cash machine. 1) Male, Black, aged 20, in a black puffa jacket, dark hooded top and a baseball cap 2) male, white, aged 20, in a brown hooded top, blue jeans and trainers.
Street Robbery	<b>KHARTOUM ROAD</b>	13/3/2005	1925	The victim was threatened with a weapon by a white male, aged 30, dressed in a beige top, blue tracksuit bottoms and a baseball cap.
Street Robbery	<b>FURZEDOWN DRIVE</b>	15/3/2005	1315	Four suspects threatened victim in attempt to rob him. 1) Male, black, aged 18, in a black jacket with a bulldog logo 2) male, black, aged 18, in a dark blue hooded top and jeans 3) male, black, aged 18 in a red cap 4) male, black, aged 18.



Theft Snatch	<b>UPPER TOOTING ROAD</b>	11/3/2005	1615	White male suspect, aged 25,snatched victim's property.
Theft Snatch	<b>GLENBURNIE ROAD</b>	14/3/2005	1424	Two thieves snatched victim's bag, causing her injury and damaging her clothing. 1) Male, aged 20, black, in a grey top and blue jeans 2) male, black, in a grey hooded top and blue jeans.

### BURGLARY

Residential Burglary	<b>CHESTNUT GROVE</b>	15/3/2005	1730	15/3/2005	2000	Thief climbed on to rear extension, broke in to flat and took property.
Residential Burglary	<b>DRAKEFIELD ROAD</b>	13/3/2005	1600	14/3/2005	0930	Intruder entered via a pane of glass in front door, which had been broken earlier, and stole property.
Non-Residential Burglary	<b>MITCHAM ROAD</b>	16/3/2005	1150	16/3/2005	1159	Thief entered manager's office and stole a camcorder. He then forced entry to another building in attempt to evade police. He was male, black, aged 37, in a black leather jacket with "Hard Rock Cafe" motif, yellow t-shirt and black baseball cap.
Residential Burglary	<b>ORMELEY ROAD</b>	14/3/2005	1705	14/3/2005	1715	20 year old black male seen to steal property from house.
Non-Residential Burglary	<b>BALHAM HIGH ROAD</b>	11/3/2005	1730	12/3/2005	0820	Suspect entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	<b>BALHAM HIGH ROAD</b>	11/3/2005	1000	11/3/2005	1515	Thief entered communal parts of building then broke down door of flat and stole.



Aggravated Burglary - Non-Residential	<b>BICKERSETH ROAD</b>	17/3/2005 0307			Suspect armed with a knife entered and stole large quantity of computer equipment.
Residential Burglary	<b>BUSHNELL ROAD</b>	14/3/2005 0915	14/3/2005	1215	Intruder forced front door, causing extensive damage, then stole property.
Residential Burglary	<b>CHESTNUT GROVE</b>	15/3/2005 1730	15/3/2005	2000	Thief broke into flat above then entered victim's flat and removed property.
Residential Burglary	<b>CLAPHAM COMMON WEST SIDE</b>	12/3/2005 0100	12/3/2005	0120	Intruder entered with intent to steal.
Residential Burglary	<b>CLOUDESDALE ROAD</b>	11/3/2005 1210	11/3/2005	1520	Thief broke down front door and removed property.
Non-Residential Burglary	<b>GLENBURNIE ROAD</b>	9/3/2005 1715	10/3/2005	0830	Thief entered through the roof, forced open a door and stole several cases of drugs.
Non-Residential Burglary	<b>GREAVES PLACE</b>	13/3/2005 2215	14/3/2005	0630	Thief forced entry through back window, entered and stole cash from coin boxes of vending machines.
Residential Burglary	<b>MITCHAM ROAD</b>	9/3/2005 1245			White male suspect, aged 20, forced entry to first floor flat, disturbed occupier and left. He was dressed in a blue hooded tracksuit with white stripes on arms.
Residential Burglary	<b>MORING ROAD</b>	17/3/2005 0430	17/3/2005	0445	Suspect entered through the front door, possibly with a flat edged screw driver, and entered but was disturbed and left.
Residential Burglary	<b>OLD DEVONSHIRE ROAD</b>	12/3/2005 0830	12/3/2005	1730	Thief slipped latch on door and stole several items.
Residential Burglary	<b>ROWFANT ROAD</b>	14/3/2005 1030	14/3/2005	1230	One of a group of schoolboys broke window.



Non-Residential Burglary	<b>ST. JAMES'S DRIVE</b>	13/3/2005 1800	14/3/2005 0840	Intruder entered through rear of premises, and tried to get out through the front, breaking a pane of glass in the door.
Non-Residential Burglary	<b>TOOTING HIGH STREET</b>	13/3/2005 0100	13/3/2005 0700	Suspect climbed wall and forced rear door open with tool. They then searched cupboards and stole property.
