Residential Burglary	<b>MITCHAM ROAD</b>	30/12/2004 1900	30/12/2004 2145	Burglar climbed in through ground floor bedroom window which was left slightly open.
Residential Burglary	<b>MITCHAM ROAD</b>	14/01/2005 1230	14/01/2005 1910	Suspect entered flat and stole from bedroom and living room.
Non-Residential Burglary	<b>MITCHAM ROAD</b>	14/1/2005 1200	17/1/2005 1000	Thief entered building under construction and stole workman's tools from tool safe.
Residential Burglary	<b>MORELLA ROAD</b>	14/01/2005 0030	14/01/2005 0730	Suspect forced entry through front sash window, entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	<b>NIGHTINGALE ROAD</b>	18/1/2005 1200	18/1/2005 1658	Suspect forced entry to premises, stole items and made off. He was aged 25, black, smartly dressed in a green coat and a white and green hat.

Residential Burglary	<b>TOOTING BEC ROAD</b>	18/1/2005 0214		Two suspects attempted to break in to rear of property. 1) Male, white, aged 31, in a white and black jacket 2) male, white, aged 21, in a red jumper, blue jeans and white trainers.



Non-Residential Burglary	<b>TOOTING HIGH STREET</b>	15/01/2005 1725			Suspect kicked open rear fire exit door and entered, but was disturbed by victim.

## ASSISTANCE

**Victim Support, tel. 0207 223 1234**, is an independent charity that helps people cope with crime.

Trained staff and volunteers based in local branches contact people, after a crime has been committed, to offer free confidential support and information. The Police and other organisations refer victims of crime to Victim Support; however some people feel able to 'pop in' to one of our branches to ask for assistance.
