| Robbery CAVENDISH ROAD personal property | 13/01/2005 | 1845 | As victim was cycling he was attacked by two black males, aged 20, in dark clothing, who attempted to steal his rucksack. |
| Robbery LAUREL CLOSE personal property | 19/01/2005 | 0400 | Victim was threatened by 28 year old male, wearing a grey jacket and blue jeans, who stole cash from him. |
| Robbery NIGHTINGALE LANE personal property | 12/01/2006 | 1955 | Victim was hit on the head with a weapon by a group of six 14 year old males who stole her phone. One was white and the others were black. |
| Robbery RECTORY LANE personal property | 12/01/2006 | 1530 | Five thieves threatened victims, searched them and stole property. 1) Male, black aged 12 2) male, black, aged 13, in school uniform 3) male, white, in grey clothing and a grey baseball cap 4) male, black, aged 12, in a blue coat with a white stripe 5) male, black, aged 17, in a black tracksuit and a camouflage cap. |
| Robbery BOLINGBROKE GROVE personal property | 13/01/2006 | 1600 | Two black youths, aged 14 And 15 threatened victim with a knife and attempted to steal. |

| Robbery CAISTOR personal ROAD property | 14/01/2006 | 2300 | 4 youths surrounded victim, threatened him and stole a mobile phone from his pocket. 1) Male, black, aged 16, in grey hooded top and black shell suit trousers 2) male, black, aged 15 3) male, Mediterranean appearance, aged 15, in dark jacket, grey hooded top and denim, jeans 4) male, Asian, aged 16, in a dark jacket. |
| Robbery ALDERBROOK personal ROAD property | 14/01/2006 | 0200 | Two black males on bikes, both aged 20, followed victim, grabbed her keys and then pushed her over and stole her handbag. They both wore scarves across their faces. |
| Robbery KELLINO personal STREET property | 14/01/2006 | 2115 | Two thieves pushed victim against a parked car, threatened him with a knife and searched his pockets. 1) Female, white, aged 30, in light coloured clothing 2) male, black, in a black coat, black jeans and a black baseball cap. |
| Robbery MACMILLAN personal WAY property | 14/01/2006 | 2140 | 14 year old white youth with a group of others, pushed victim and stole her bag and phone. |
| Robbery BEDFORD HILL personal property | 14/01/2006 | 1755 | Victim was pushed off his mountain bike which was then stolen by a black male, aged 16, in a black puffa jacket, grey hooded top, grey tracksuit trousers, black trainers and a pink NY baseball cap. |
| Robbery TOOTING personal HIGH STREET property | 14/01/2006 | 1000 | As victim was using cash dispenser the money was snatched from behind by a 35 year old black male in a black hat and coat. |
| Robbery DAGNAN personal ROAD property | 15/01/2006 | 1950 | Two 15 year old black males in dark clothing attacked victim from behind and attempted to steal property. |
| Robbery GLENBURNIE personal ROAD property | 15/01/2006 | 2100 | Two black males in dark hooded tops threatened victim with a gun, drove him away in his own car and stole property. |

| Robbery personal property | MANCHURIA ROAD | 15/01/2006 | 0110 | 16 year old black male on a pedal cycle approached victim from behind and grabbed her handbag. She held on and was dragged along by the thief. He was dressed in dark clothing, a dark beanie hat and a black scarf. |
| Assault with intent to rob - personal property | BALHAM HIGH ROAD | 16/01/2006 | 0915 | Black male with a black and white bandana punched female victim several times and demanded money. |
| Robbery personal property | MALWOOD ROAD | 17/01/2006 | 2235 | Six thieves attacked victim from behind and stole her handbag. Four were black, aged 14-17, and the other two were white, aged 14. |
| Robbery personal property | MONTANA ROAD | 17/01/2006 | 2038 | Two ten year old white boys pushed victim from behind and stole her mobile phone. One was wearing a black hooded anorak with fleece around the collar. |
| Robbery business property | BALHAM HIGH ROAD | 17/01/2006 | 2050 | Victim was threatened by white male, aged 45, who stole two bottles of wine. He was wearing a green jacket, Adidas t-shirt with white stripes on the arms and a gold chain. |
| Robbery personal property | LYSIAS ROAD | 17/01/2006 | 2055 | Asian male, aged 21, followed victim from tube station then grabbed her bag, dragging her to the ground. The victim held onto the bag and the suspect was chased off by a passer-by. |
| Robbery personal property | BALHAM HILL | 18/01/2006 | 1433 | 17 year old male, Mediterranean appearance, entered office, pushed victim and stole her mobile phone. |
| Robbery personal property | MITCHAM ROAD | 18/01/2006 | 1415 | 20 year old black man threatened to use force and stole property. He was wearing a black puffa jacket with a hood, blue trousers, and a black jumper with "YO" in orange. |

| Burglary dwelling | ENDLESHAM ROAD | 10/01/2006 | 1700 | 10/01/2006 | 1715 | Communal front door split from top to bottom in attempt to enter flats. |
| Burglary non-residential | CAVENDISH ROAD | 11/01/2006 | 0200 | 11/01/2006 | 0900 | Burglar broke a glass panel in a side door then entered and removed property. |
| Burglary dwelling | CHILLERTON ROAD | 11/01/2006 | 0010 | 11/01/2006 | 0845 | Intruder entered whilst victims were asleep and stole property from hallway. |
| Burglary dwelling | CROWBOROUGH ROAD | 11/01/2006 | 0010 | 11/01/2006 | 0630 | Thief entered and stole. |
| Burglary dwelling | ELMFIELD ROAD | 11/01/2006 | 2030 | 12/01/2006 | 0700 | Thief entered and stole. |
| Burglary dwelling | ESWYN ROAD | 11/01/2006 | 1740 | 11/01/2006 | 1840 | Intruder broke rear window then stole property from house. |
| Burglary dwelling | BEEHCROFT ROAD | 12/01/2006 | 0000 | | | |
| Burglary dwelling | BEEHCROFT ROAD | 12/01/2006 | 0248 | | | Thief tried to enter premises. |
| Burglary dwelling | DERINTON ROAD | 12/01/2006 | 1000 | 17/01/2006 | 1330 | Jewellery taken from container on windowsill, possibly by workmen. |
| Burglary non-residential | UPPER TOOTING ROAD | 12/01/2006 | 0030 | 12/01/2006 | 1030 | Intruder forced small rear window, entered and stole items. |

| Burglary dwelling | WOODBURY STREET | 13/01/2006 1230 | 17/01/2006 1530 | Front window of flat smashed and a set of taps taken. |
| Burglary dwelling | AMEN CORNER | 14/01/2006 2155 | 14/01/2006 2200 | 41 year old white male in black top and trousers broke glass panel in door of flat and entered. He then threatened victim with a piece of wood, broke another window and left. |
| Burglary dwelling | THURLEIGH ROAD | 14/01/2006 2359 | 15/01/2006 1200 | By persons unknown entering the victims room when it was left unlocked and stealing property from within. |
| Burglary non-residential | UPPER TOOTING ROAD | 15/01/2006 0015 | | 25 year old black male entered and removed property. He was dressed in a long dark jacket, dark jeans and dark trainers and possibly wearing a black woollen hat. |
| Burglary dwelling | GOSBERTON ROAD | 16/01/2006 1500 | 16/01/2006 1800 | Burglar climbed into back garden and then attempted to kick open door. |
| Burglary dwelling | SELKIRK ROAD | 16/01/2006 0125 | | Burglar climbed fence and opened insecure window. |
| Burglary dwelling | BRUDENELL ROAD | 17/01/2006 2330 | 18/01/2006 0730 | Burglar forced front door and stole property from the hallway. |
| Burglary dwelling | ELDERFIELD PLACE | 17/01/2006 0330 | | Burglar forced window, entered flat and removed property. |
| Burglary dwelling | ESWYN ROAD | 17/01/2006 2230 | 18/01/2006 0709 | Front door forced by burglar when then entered. |

| Burglary dwelling | MANTILLA ROAD | 17/01/20060255 | 17/01/20060300 | Burglar broke stained glass kitchen window and attempted to open window but was defeated by window lock. He then stole food within reach and took bike wheels from outside. |
| Burglary non-residential | MITCHAM ROAD | 17/01/20062100 | 18/01/20060900 | Burglar broke glass in front door and entered store. |
| Burglary dwelling | SOUTHCROFT ROAD | 17/01/20061350 | 18/01/20060001 | Intruder forced entry through window and then stole computer and speaker and left through window. |
| Burglary dwelling | SOUTHCROFT ROAD | 17/01/20061350 | 18/01/20060001 | Thief forced entry through window and stole computer. |
| Burglary dwelling | STATION PARADE, BALHAM HIGH ROAD | 17/01/20060900 | 17/01/20061845 | Burglar entered, probably through first floor window, and stole property. |
| Burglary dwelling | BEEHCROFT ROAD | 18/01/20060030 | 18/01/20060820 | Burglar forced front door and stole items from hallway. |
| Burglary dwelling | BEECHES ROAD | 18/01/20060350 | | Burglar forced front door, entered and stole property. |
| Burglary dwelling | BEECHES ROAD | 18/01/20060350 | | Intruder forced front door and stole property. |
