Attached are details of the street crimes and burglaries reported to Tooting police between 14 October and 21 October, 2004

STREET CRIME

Offence Place	Date	Time	Method
Street SOUTHCROFT Robbery ROAD	13/10/2004	1420	Two suspects forcibly stole property. Both were black, male, and aged 16, wearing school ties.
Street PENWORTHAM Robbery ROAD	14/10/2004	1900	Two suspects held victim around neck and stole her shoulder bag. Both were male, black, aged 23, wearing dark clothing. One wore a dark woollen hat.
Street MITCHAM Robbery ROAD	15/10/2004	2300	Four black men and one black woman, aged 25, dressed in dark clothing, cut victim's head with knife and stole property.
Street COATEFORD Robbery ROAD	15/10/2004	2230	18 year old black suspect threatened and punched victim and stole mobile phone. He was wearing blue jeans, blue padded jacket with Nike symbol and piping on back in a "V" shape.
Street WOODBURY Robbery STREET	17/10/2004	0410	Victim was attacked by three black males, who stole property from him.
Street BALHAM HIGH Robbery ROAD	17/10/2004	0300	Suspect forced his way into house, punched victim in the face and stole a bag. He was male, white, and aged 24.
Street TOOTING Robbery HIGH STREET	19/10/2004	1320	Three suspects demanded money and stole rings. 1) Female, white, 35 yrs, in a white jumper and blue denim jeans 2) white male, 35, in a dark fleece 3) 35 yrs, male, white in a long black coat



DOCTOR JOHNSON AVENUE	18/10/2004 1555	By two suspects: - 1) 20 yrs, male, black, in black t-shirt, green camouflage trousers, black cap and white trainers 2) 25 yrs, black, male, in dark blue padded waistcoat, denim jacket, black jeans and blue bandana.

Residential Burglary	LYNWOOD ROAD	17/10/20040620		Male suspect, wearing bulky clothing, forced open ground floor window, but was disturbed as he tried to enter.

ASSISTANCE

Victim Support is an independent charity that helps people cope with crime.

Trained staff and volunteers, based in local branches, contact people after a crime has been committed, to offer free, confidential support and information. The Police and other organisations refer victims of crime to Victim Support; however some people feel able to 'pop in' to one of our branches to ask for assistance.
