



## Tooting Crime Briefing

22 September, 2004

Attached are details of the street crimes and burglaries reported to Tooting police between 15 September and 22 September, 2004

### STREET CRIME

Offence Place	Date	Time	Method
Street <b>SPALDING</b> Robbery <b>ROAD</b>	15/09/2004	0845	18 year old black male threatened to beat up victim, intimating he had a knife, and stole gold ring. He was wearing a black tracksuit, blue trainers and a black hat, and had a diamond earring in his left ear.
Street <b>MITCHAM</b> Robbery <b>ROAD</b>	15/09/2004	1555	Two thieves stopped victims, searched them and stole property. They were both aged 20, black, one in a dark blue top and jeans, and the other in casual clothing with a woollen hat.
Street <b>WELHAM</b> Robbery <b>ROAD</b>	17/09/2004	1200	Suspect punched victim in face and threatened to stab him. He was aged 18, black, wearing a black hooded top and jeans and was riding a dirty green mountain bike.
Street <b>SMALLWOOD</b> Robbery <b>ROAD</b>	17/09/2004	1945	Suspect assaulted victim and stole property.
Street <b>TOPSHAM</b> Robbery <b>ROAD</b>	18/09/2004	1250	Two suspects threatened victim with a knife and stole cash. Both were white males, one aged 35, dressed in a blue jacket and trousers.
Street <b>MITCHAM</b> Robbery <b>ROAD</b>	18/09/2004	2232	By two black males aged 16-17, one in a grey hooded top and trainers, the other in a red hooded top and trainers.



Street Robbery	<b>BIRCHWOOD ROAD</b>	19/09/2004 2245	Victim was approached by three suspects who punched him and threatened him with a knife. What seemed to be a gun was pushed into the back of his neck, and he was searched and property was taken from him. All three were black, male, and aged 18. One wore a baggy white t-shirt and a light baseball cap. The second had a thigh length black woollen coat and a dark purple hat. No useful description of the third suspect.
Theft Snatch	<b>BICKLEY STREET</b>	15/09/2004 1230	"8 year old black male snatched victim's mobile phone. He was wearing a black t-shirt and blue jeans.
Theft Snatch	<b>FERNLEA ROAD</b>	19/09/2004 0330	18 year old male in light grey hooded top snatched victim's bag from behind.

Non-Residential Burglary	<b>TRINITY ROAD</b>	14/09/2004 2100	15/09/2004 0825	Intruder forced door of club house and stole property.
Non-Residential Burglary	<b>TOOTING HIGH STREET</b>	15/09/2004 0530		Suspect forced entry through rear window, causing damage, entered and forced cellar door then stole property.
Non-Residential Burglary	<b>TOOTING BEC ROAD</b>	15/09/2004 1630		Two drunken suspects who had been refused entry to shop caused a disturbance and stole bottles of drink. 1) 25 yrs, male, white, wearing a dark blue t-shirt 2) 25 yrs, male, Mediterranean appearance, wearing a dark red t-shirt and a dark baseball cap.
Non-Residential Burglary	<b>BLACKSHAW ROAD</b>	15/09/2004 1600	16/09/2004 0800	Suspect entered offices and stole property.
Non-Residential Burglary	<b>MITCHAM ROAD</b>	15/09/2004 1700	16/09/2004 0700	Thief kicked out glass in front door, entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	<b>DERINTON ROAD</b>	15/09/2004 1445	15/09/2004 1630	Suspect broke glass in front door but was unable to open it due to the mortise lock.
Non-Residential Burglary	<b>BLACKSHAW ROAD</b>	16/09/2004 1350	16/09/2004 1355	20 year old black male, wearing grey trousers and green short sleeved shirt with red, white and blue check, entered office and stole property.

Residential Burglary	<b>STAPLETON ROAD</b>	16/09/2004 0845	16/09/2004 2300	Burglar entered through front door
Residential Burglary	<b>RENMUIR STREET</b>	16/09/2004 1200	16/09/2004 1800	Thief entered ground floor flat after breaking bathroom window, and stole items.
Residential Burglary	<b>STAPLETON ROAD</b>	16/09/2004 0845	16/09/2004 2300	Intruder entered through front door and stole property.
Burglary Artifice - Non Residential	<b>BLACKSHAW ROAD</b>	17/09/2004 2000	17/09/2004 2015	Suspect posed as a computer engineer and took computer, stating it needed repairing . He was aged 30, white, wearing a blue t-shirt, blue jumper worn inside out and a fluorescent jacket. He appeared to be wearing an identity card.
Non-Residential Burglary	<b>BLACKSHAW ROAD</b>	17/09/2004 1200	20/09/2004 1230	Suspect forced open window entered and stole property
Residential Burglary	<b>GATTON ROAD</b>	17/09/2004 0845	17/09/2004 0845	Suspect attempted to enter through rear window after breaking glass and bending window frame.
Residential Burglary	<b>CAISTOR ROAD</b>	17/09/2004 2000	19/09/2004 1930	Suspect entered through open toilet window and stole.
Residential Burglary	<b>CAVENDISH ROAD</b>	18/09/2004 0030	18/09/2004 0630	Suspect entered and took property.
Residential Burglary	<b>BRODRICK ROAD</b>	18/09/2004 1100	18/09/2004 1300	Burglar entered and stole.



Residential Burglary	<b>RECTORY LANE</b>	19/09/2004 1520	19/09/2004 2245	Suspects forced open front door to the flat and removed a lap top bag and mobile phone of residential property
Residential Burglary	<b>RITHERDON ROAD</b>	20/09/2004 0500	20/09/2004 1100	Property stolen from staircase outside flat.
Non-Residential Burglary	<b>TRINITY ROAD</b>	21/09/2004 2035	22/09/2004 0735	Suspect forced open a boarded up window, entered and attempted to steal property.
Residential Burglary	<b>BALHAM HIGH ROAD</b>	21/09/2004 0945	21/09/2004 1910	Suspects entered using a key stolen in a previous burglary and then forced entry to the front door of flat and stole property.
Residential Burglary	<b>BALHAM HIGH ROAD</b>	21/09/2004 1030	21/09/2004 1930	Suspect broke into flat and stole property.
Non-Residential Burglary	<b>MITCHAM ROAD</b>	15/09/2004 1700	16/09/2004 0700	Burglar kicked out pane of glass in front door, entered and stole.
