Residential Burglary	CULVERDEN ROAD	22/08/2004 0500	22/08/2004 0510	Entry gained using ladder to reach first floor bedroom window where window was forced off its frame. The intruder left when he activated the alarm.
Residential Burglary	HOLMSIDE ROAD	22/08/2004 1430	22/08/2004 1700	Garage door was damaged in attempt to enter.
Residential Burglary	FISHPONDS ROAD	23/08/2004 2245	23/08/2004 2246	Suspect entered through the front door and then removed the victim's property.
Residential Burglary	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	24/08/2004 0700	24/08/2004 2000	Suspect entered flat and stole CD player and CDs.
Non-Residential Burglary	MITCHAM ROAD	19/08/2004 1500		Suspect leant over counter and stole cash from till.

ASSISTANCE

Trained staff and volunteers, based in local branches, contact people after a crime has been committed, to offer free, confidential support and information.
