



Tooting Crime Briefing

25 November, 2004

Attached are details of the street crimes and burglaries reported to Tooting police between 19 November and 25 November, 2004

STREET CRIME

| Offence Place | Date | Time | Method |

| Street DAGNAN Robbery ROAD | 18/11/2004 | 1540 | By three 25 year old white men, one in a grey hooded top. |
| Street TRINITY ROAD Robbery | 19/11/2004 | 0928 | Two thieves threatened victim with a knife and stole his bicycle. 1) 15 yrs, male, black, in grey hooded top and black trousers with a white stripe 2) 14 yrs, black, male, thin faced, wearing a black woollen hat. |
| Street WELHAM Robbery ROAD | 19/11/2004 | 0035 | Victim was hit on the head by four suspects, who then knocked him to the ground, kicked him and stole his property. They were all aged 19 yrs, black, male in dark clothing. One had a black cap with a white line. |
| Street TOOTING Robbery HIGH STREET | 21/11/2004 | 2244 | Suspect threatened victim, demanded property from him and punched him in the face. He was aged 16, black, in a black 3/4 length fur-lined coat, light grey tracksuit trousers and dark grey Nike trainers. |
| Street NIGHTINGALE Robbery WALK | 22/11/2004 | 0830 | Victim on bike was stopped by black male suspect, aged 16, who threatened to punch and stab him. |
| Street NIGHTINGALE Robbery SQUARE | 23/11/2004 | 0930 | Victim, a postman, was pushed into a wall and post was stole from his trolley by a 25 year old black male, wearing a blue woollen hat. |
| Street RACHAM Robbery LANE | 23/11/2004 | 1035 | Two suspects used force and stole property from victim. 1) Male, black, 18 yrs, in dark blue jacket with "FUBU" in red on back 2) male, black, 18 yrs, in white baseball cap and dark blue tracksuit. |

| Street Robbery | BADMINTON ROAD | 24/11/20040220 | Black male suspect attempted to grab victim's bag as he rode past, pulling victim to the ground. |
| Street Robbery | | 24/11/20040104 | Victim was beaten up by six suspects, who stole various items from him. |
| Theft Snatch | TOOTING BROADWAY | 01/11/20041200 | Suspect asked victim the time, then snatched her handbag. He was aged 35, black, in jeans, trainers and a hat. |
| Theft Snatch | LONGLEY ROAD | 19/11/20041745 | As the victim was using her phone it was snatched by a suspect who came up behind her. He was aged 19, Mediterranean appearance, in black jeans and tight-fitting black hooded top. |
| Theft Snatch | HENDRICK AVENUE | 24/11/20041800 | Victim was distracted by first suspect, who stole her bicycle light, while the other took her bag from the back of the bike. 1) 25 yrs, male, white, in grey casual jacket, dark trousers and cap, riding a dark bicycle 2) no useful description. |

| Residential Burglary | MAYFORD ROAD | 19/11/2004 0445 | 19/11/2004 0450 | Suspect entered house through a rear window. |
| Residential Burglary | NOTTINGHAM ROAD | 19/11/2004 1600 | 21/11/2004 1400 | Intruder entered through rear window or patio door and stole property. |
| Residential Burglary | ST. JAMES'S DRIVE | 19/11/2004 1600 | 21/11/2004 0045 | Burglar forced panel from kitchen door at back of house, entered and removed property from cupboards. |
| Residential Burglary | BALHAM HIGH ROAD | 20/11/2004 1200 | | Suspect broke into flat by forcing open front door. |
| Residential Burglary | BROADWATER ROAD | 20/11/2004 1600 | 21/11/2004 1230 | Suspect broke in and stole property. |
| Residential Burglary | FOUNTAIN ROAD | 20/11/2004 0200 | 20/11/2004 0400 | Suspect broke in and searched premises. |
| Residential Burglary | RITHERDON ROAD | 20/11/2004 0800 | 20/11/2004 1544 | Suspect forced open front door, but activated alarm and left. |
| Residential Burglary | BOUNDARIES ROAD | 22/11/2004 0830 | | |
| Residential Burglary | CLAIRVIEW ROAD | 22/11/2004 1755 | 22/11/2004 1800 | Suspect climbed into garden, removed air vent from window and opened window. They then took a key from ledge, opened back door and entered, but activated the alarm and did not steal anything. |

| Non-Residential Burglary | ST GEORGES GROVE | 21/11/2004 | 1720 | 21/11/2004 | 1740 | Thief entered brick outhouse, unscrewed lock on metal gate and then kicked internal door and stole pedal cycle |

ASSISTANCE

Victim Support, tel. 0207 223 1234, is an independent charity that helps people cope with crime.

Trained staff and volunteers, based in local branches, contact people after a crime has been committed, to offer free, confidential support and information. The Police and other organisations refer victims of crime to Victim Support; however some people feel able to 'pop in' to one of our branches to ask for assistance.
