STREET CRIME

Offence	Place	Date	Time	Method
Street Robbery	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	19/05/2004	1218	Five youths surrounded victim and demanded his cash and mobile phone. He managed to break loose and run off. One of the suspects was male, black, 18 yrs, in a dark top and trousers and wearing a yellow baseball cap.
Street Robbery	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	19/05/2004	1710	Asian male, 20, punched and kicked victim.
Theft Snatch	MITCHAM ROAD	18/05/2004	1300	By two males, one white, wearing blue trousers and black hooded top, the other black, aged 18 wearing a light blue baseball cap.
Street Robbery	MITCHAM ROAD	21/05/2004	0030	By black male in his 40s.
Street Robbery	WELHAM ROAD	24/05/2004	1620	Black suspect aged 22, in grey hooded top, dark baseball cap and dark jeans, repeatedly asking for ride on victims pedal cycle. The victim felt intimidated and gave pedal cycle to suspect, who made off.

Residential Burglary	GARRATT LANE	24/05/2004 0745	24/05/2004 1800	Suspects possibly walked into the premises as work was being carried out
Residential Burglary	NIMROD ROAD	24/05/2004 2100	25/05/2004 0001	Suspect entered through a rear unlocked door and then stole property.
Residential Burglary	HAWTHORN CRESCENT	11/05/2004 1400	19/05/2004 1500	Thief forced door of victim's room and stole property.
Residential Burglary	RITHERDON ROAD	14/05/2004 1600	22/05/2004 0800	Front door forced open and property taken.
Non-Residential Burglary	SARSELD ROAD	18/05/2004 1500	19/05/2004 1245	Thief stole pedal cycle from lean-to in garden.
Residential Burglary	RITHERDON ROAD	20/05/2004 1225	20/05/2004 1227	19 year old male, white, dressed in dark blue tracksuit, blue/white baseball cap and white black and blue trainers, climbed over wall into victim's garden.
Residential Burglary	HURON ROAD	21/05/2004 1930	22/05/2004 2300	Premises entered and items taken
Residential Burglary	RITHERDON ROAD	21/05/2004 2200	22/05/2004 0001	Two handbags stolen from just inside unlocked back door, whilst premises were occupied.
Residential Burglary	BOUNDARIES ROAD	23/05/2004 1500		Suspect pushed past victim, entered house and took property. He was black, aged 17, in a white t-shirt and black tracksuit trousers.
Non-Residential Burglary	FRANCISCAN ROAD	23/05/2004 1830		Intruder smashed a glass panel in the door and a window at the front of the house.
Residential Burglary	ST. JAMES'S DRIVE	23/05/2004 0900	23/05/2004 2130	Suspect forced entry through the front door and stole items. He was white, 30 yrs, in a white t-shirt with a St. George's cross on it.



Non-Residential Burglary	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	24/05/2004 1700	25/05/2004 0800	Burglar broke into a house under renovation and stole builder's tools.
Residential Burglary	NIMROD ROAD	24/05/2004 2100	25/05/2004 0001	Suspect entered property through a rear unlocked door and then stole items.
