Street Robbery	UPPER TOOTING ROAD	24/02/2004	1200	Victim was threatened by suspect claiming to have a knife. He was black, 16 yrs old, wearing a black jacket with yellow piping, black cap and dark trousers.
Theft Snatch	UPPER TOOTING ROAD	20/02/2004	1624	
Street Robbery	COWICK ROAD	23/02/2004	1100	Victim dropped purse. Male, black, suspect in navy trousers and black jacket knocked her to floor and stole it.
Commercial Robbery	SMALLWOOD ROAD	23/02/2004	1535	Black suspect, 38 yrs, threatened victim with long knife and demanded cash from till. A struggle followed, resulting in injury to victim, and suspect left empty handed.
Street Robbery	MITCHAM ROAD	18/02/2004	2345	Victim was kicked in the back causing him to fall and cut his leg in two places, and then three male suspects stole items from him.
Street Robbery	AMEN CORNER	22/02/2004	0145	Black male suspect, 22 yrs, in red hooded top, blue jeans and orange/brown hat threatened victim and took £20.
Street Robbery	RIBBLESDALE ROAD	19/02/2004	0130	Three 20 yr old suspects, both in dark zipped jumpers, assaulted victim and stole property.
Commercial Robbery	MITCHAM LANE	24/02/2004	1755	18 yr old black male suspect in light grey hooded top, light grey track bottom and baseball cap, pushed victim and stole property.

Theft Snatch	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	19/02/2004	1240	Two black male suspects snatched bag from victim's shoulder. First was 25 yrs, in denim jacket and black trousers, the other was aged 30 yrs.
Street Robbery	CHESTNUT GROVE	17/02/2004	0515	The victim was approached by two males who pushed him and threatened to shoot him unless he handed over his money
Street Robbery	JAGGARD WAY	19/02/2004	2300	The victim was robbed at knife point by black male 30 yrs, in jeans and dark T-shirt.
Street Robbery	BELLEVUE ROAD	20/02/2004	1740	Two 16 yr old white females threatened victim in attempt to steal, then chased victim. The first wore dark clothing; the second wore a light blue top, dark trousers and trainers.
Street Robbery	SARSFELD ROAD	24/02/2004	1700	15 yr old black male suspect, in blue/black hooded top with white logo near shoulder, grabbed victim and stole her bag.
Street Robbery	HEARNVILLE ROAD	25/02/2004	0910	As victim was putting her children in her car she was pushed back into the car and her handbag was stolen by a black male, 28 yrs, wearing a black beanie hat, black jacket, black trousers and black trainers.
Street Robbery	CHARLMONT ROAD	18/02/2004	2025	Male white suspect, 22 yrs, in black puffa jacket and blue jeans, demanded money phone and jewellery.

Residential Burglary	ENDLESHAM ROAD	18/02/2004	0800	18/02/2004	1830	White male suspect in red/cream hooded jacket, jeans, and white gloves entered and stole property.
Residential Burglary	ENDLESHAM ROAD	18/02/2004	1430	18/02/2004	1730	Suspect forced front door, entered and stole items of property.
Residential Burglary	ENDLESHAM ROAD	18/02/2004	1430	18/02/2004	1730	Suspect forced entry to a garage by smashing the lock. Once inside removed tools.
Residential Burglary	ENDLESHAM ROAD	18/02/2004	1430	18/02/2004	1730	Burglar entered and stole items.
Residential Burglary	ENDLESHAM ROAD	18/02/2004	0800	18/02/2004	1830	Suspect forced front door latch, entered and stole.
Residential Burglary	CATHLES ROAD	18/02/2004	0830	18/02/2004	2330	Suspect forced open an office door and stole property.
Residential Burglary	BIRCHWOOD ROAD	19/02/2004	0815	19/02/2004	0845	Suspect(s) cut padlock to front gates and took plywood sheets and then forced entry to lock up and stole lawn mower.
Non-Residential Burglary	WELHAM ROAD	19/02/2004	1310			Suspects used implement to remove keys from premises. They then stole the vehicle.

Residential Burglary	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	19/02/2004	0545	19/02/2004	1700	Suspect forced front door.
Residential Burglary	OLD DEVONSHIRE ROAD	18/02/2004	1100	19/02/2004	1900	Suspect entered communal area then stole property.
Residential Burglary	CROWBOROUGH ROAD	19/02/2004	1000	20/02/2004	0630	Suspect entered using a key, switched off the alarm, took keys from the bar, unlocked the office and took the safe keys, went to the cellar and emptied the safe and a filing cabinet of cash.
Residential Burglary	FALLSBROOK ROAD	20/02/2004	0230	20/02/2004	1030	Suspect entered by means unknown and removed property
Residential Burglary	FRANCISCAN ROAD	21/02/2004	0650	21/02/2004	2130	Suspect entered and stole.
Non-Residential Burglary	BICKERSTETH ROAD	21/02/2004	1700	23/02/2004	1130	Suspects entered flat above shops by forcing the front door. They then searched the premises and stole a laptop.
Residential Burglary	CROWBOROUGH ROAD	18/02/2004	2300	19/02/2004	0630	Two white female suspects went to area behind counter and stole property. One was wearing dark clothing and had a diamond stud in a front tooth, the other, also wearing dark clothing, had dark make-up around eyes and had bad skin.
Residential Burglary	TOOTING HIGH STREET	22/02/2004	1100	22/02/2004	1830	Suspect forced open fire exit, then forced several fruit machines and stole cash.
