Theft Snatch	FRANSISCAN ROAD	19/01/2005	2130	20 year old black male suspect approached victim from behind and stole her bag.
Commercial Robbery	BELLEVUE ROAD	25/01/2005	2210	Male suspect entered shop and threatened the staff with a firearm in order to steal money.
Street Robbery	COVERTON ROAD	26/1/2005	1945	Suspect approached victim, asked for money and when refused hit the victim with a piece of lead. He was white, aged 20, in a cream puffa jacket and jeans.
Street Robbery	TOOTING BROADWAY	25/01/2005	2130	Group of 5 males, age 17-20, forced mobile phone from female victim.
Street Robbery	FOUNTAIN ROAD	23/01/2005	0140	Four white male suspects, aged 26-32, attacked victims and stole a phone.
Street Robbery	HIMLEY ROAD	22/01/2005	2240	Three suspects approached victim from behind, pushed her and snatched her shoulder bag. 1) Black, male, aged 15, in dark clothing 2) male, black, in dark clothing and a black baseball cap 3) male, black, aged 15.
Street Robbery	BLACKSHAW ROAD	21/01/2005	2130	Black male suspect held knife to victim's eye and demanded money. He wore dark jeans and a dark, tight, round necked jumper.



Street Robbery	TOOTING BEC ROAD	21/01/20052100	Three suspects pulled victim from a bus and attempted to steal her handbag. 1) Male, aged 25, black, wearing black trousers, black jacket and grey and black trainers 2) male, aged 25, black, wearing a black jacket over a red top and with a black hooded top over both, and dark trousers 3) male, black, aged 17, wearing a dark hooded top and dark trousers.
Street Robbery	OUSELEY ROAD	19/01/20052100	Victim was pushed to the ground by a suspect in dark clothing who stole her bag.
Theft Snatch	BALHAM HILL	22/01/20050210	Victim waiting at bus stop had her bag snatched from her shoulder.

Burglary Artifice - Residential	BRUDENELL ROAD	26/1/2005	1139	26/1/2005	1149	Suspects posed as plain clothes police officers, showing poor fake ID, and tricked their way into victim's home. 1) Male, white, aged 30, wearing a navy blue anorak, navy trousers and dirty boots 2) male, white aged 40, in navy trousers, navy top and dirty boots.
Burglary Artifice - Residential	BLEGBOROUGH ROAD	24/01/2005	1350			Two suspects posed as police officers in order to gain entry, then stole cash from drawer. Both were male, aged 40, white, one in a black jacket and dark trousers and the other in dark clothing.
Non-Residential Burglary	BELLEVUE ROAD	25/01/2005	2100	25/01/2005	2102	Male suspect entered the staff area of shop and stole a mobile phone.

Residential Burglary	SISTOVA ROAD	21/01/2005 0900	24/01/2005 2200	Burglar forced open front sash window and stole property and keys. He then stole a car parked outside, using the keys.
Residential Burglary	CLAPHAM COMMON WEST SIDE	20/01/2005 2330	21/01/2005 0829	Burglar broke glass panel beside door in attempt to enter.
Residential Burglary	FERNLEA ROAD	20/01/2005 0900	20/01/2005 1900	Suspect forced entry to rear door entered premises and stole items
Residential Burglary	PENWORTHAM ROAD	20/01/2005 1400	20/01/2005 1400	Suspect entered house through front door after smashing glass, then stole property.
Residential Burglary	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	18/01/2005 0830	18/01/2005 1730	Suspect forced entry through a communal door and then forced open the front door of the flat before entering and stealing property.
Residential Burglary	BALHAM PARK ROAD	18/01/2005 0930	18/01/2005 2130	Thief broke in and stole.
Residential Burglary	DERINTON ROAD	18/01/2005 0001	25/01/2005 0900	Suspect entered house using a stolen key and stole property.
