



Tooting Crime Briefing

30 June, 2005

Attached are details of the street crimes and burglaries reported to Tooting police between 23 June and 30 June, 2005

STREET CRIME

Offence	Street	Date	Time Method
Theft Snatch	UPPER TOOTING ROAD	20/06/2005	2230 Two thieves approached victim from behind and snatched bag. 1) Female, black, aged 18, in jeans and a black top with a picture on 2) male, black, aged 18, in white trousers and a sports top.
Theft Snatch	GLASFORD STREET	22/06/2005	1900 Black male grabbed victim's phone from behind. He was wearing a green t-shirt, black tracksuit trousers, black trainers and a green baseball cap.
Theft Snatch	MITCHAM ROAD	22/06/2005	1915 Black male pulled bag from victim's shoulder. He wore grey hooded top and grey tracksuit trousers.
Street Robbery	TOOTING HIGH STREET	23/06/2005	2330 As victim sat in his car two suspects approached, damaged the car and assaulted victim, and then snatched his mobile phone.
Street Robbery	BELLEVUE ROAD	24/06/2005	2200 Two thieves engaged victim in conversation and asked if he had a mobile phone, then attacked him, causing serious injuries to his face, 1) Male, black, aged 16, in an Avirex jacket 2) male, black, aged 15, in a grey hooded tracksuit top.



Street Robbery	FRANCISCAN ROAD	24/06/2005	1100	Suspect asked victim to pull over as he had hit his car. As he did so he was approached by three further suspects who threatened him with a knife, forced him to drive to another location and stole property from him. 1) Male, aged 23, black, dressed in dark clothing and white trainers 2), 3) & 4) all aged about 19, male, wearing stockings over their faces.
Street Robbery	FERNLEA ROAD	25/06/2005	2125	Three thieves approached victim from behind, punched him and stole his property. All were aged 19, male and black. One wore dark clothing and another had baggy blue jeans and a black cap.
Street Robbery	FOSS ROAD	25/06/2005	1730	13 year old black boy punched victim and attempted to steal his mobile phone.
Theft Snatch	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	26/06/2005	1210	Two 30 year old males distracted victim, then stole a large quantity of cash from his hand. One was white and the other of Mediterranean appearance.
Street Robbery	SMALLWOOD ROAD	27/06/2005	1430	Two white thieves, aged 16 and 18 beat up victim and stole mobile phone.
Street Robbery	TOOTING BEC ROAD	23/06/2005	1500	Thief threatened victim and stole his mobile phone.

BURGLARY

Residential Burglary	TRINITY ROAD	26/06/2005	1800	27/06/2005	1000	Burglar entered through bedroom window and stole.
Residential Burglary	BOUNDARIES RD	18/06/2005	1130	18/06/2005	1700	Intruder entered bedroom and stole watch and wallet.



Residential Burglary	BALHAM HIGH ROAD	21/06/2005	0935	21/06/2005	1245	Burglar forced door then stole from bedroom.
Residential Burglary	CARLWELL STREET	23/06/2005	0800	23/06/2005	2030	Suspect entered and took property.
Residential Burglary	DORNTON ROAD	23/06/2005	1700	24/06/2005	1921	Burglar forced a locked sash window and stole an antique clock and a bag.
Residential Burglary	BEDFORD HILL	27/06/2005	0915	27/06/2005	2200	Burglar entered through open window and stole.
Non-Residential Burglary	ALDRINGTON ROAD	27/06/2005	2230	28/06/2005	0630	Thief forced up and over garage door, breaking three locks, entered and stole. He was a white male, aged 16.
