Your team are working on the following priorities

#### Burglary.

We are still suffering burglaries on the ward. We have increased patrols assisted by response teams. If you have seen anything suspicious, call us, it could be that bit of information we need.

#### Anti Social behaviour by youths

We have increased high visibility patrols around Furzedown Rec and the shops on Moyser Road, due to residents concerns regarding youths in the area after school.

#### Good news

Whilst on patrols your team stopped and searched a youth that was acting suspiciously. He was found to have a knife down his trousers and was subsequently arrested.

### Personal Safety Advice

Think ahead and plan your journey, avoiding deserted areas.

Try to avoid walking alone at night, and keep to well-lit main roads where possible. You should try to avoid short cuts like alleyways, waste ground and wooded, bushy areas.

Stay alert: be aware of what's going on around you.

It is always worth letting someone know where you are going, the route you intend to take and when you expect to return.

Try to avoid wearing headphones - your ability to hear traffic, strangers or potential trouble is severely restricted.
