Robberies down 13.5% 5 less offences

Since our last Newsletter Search warrants have been obtained and executed by your SNT. At two addresses, one in Furzedown and the other in Sutton, these resulted in the recovery of two handguns, a quantity of amphetamines and approximately £45,000 cash, with several arrests being made. PC Webb and Eburne led these operations. Thankfully handguns are still a very rare event and we are committed to reducing circulation.

Complaints from local residents lead Furzedown SNT to attend Leverson Street to deal with antisocial behaviour by people drinking and urinating in the street. Furzedown SNT attended Leverson Street where the group were spoken to and arrests made.

Also in Leverson Street PCSOs Marsh and Conlan met with residents to listen first hand to concerns and better understand the needs of the community.

Burglary

Furzedown has witnessed an increase in burglary, which was attributed to a prolific offender living on the ward. I am pleased to report that this offender was arrested in August and is currently in prison on remand. His arrest was as a direct result of intelligence from Furzedown SNT.

To help us tackle bicycle crimes follow these simple steps to keep your property safe:

- Get a good bike lock (D locks or combination locks are best. Look for Sold Secure Ltd approved locks or ask for a recommendation at a bike shop).
- Lock your bike to something secure - a bike rack or lamppost.
- Lock up removable parts (for example, wheels) or take them with you (for example, light fittings and saddles).
- Have your bike security marked or engraved
