## Anvil Close

Furzedown SNT have recently installed temporary Police CCTV cameras at the entrance to Anvil Close. These cameras will be used to evidence anti social behaviour by groups of youths congregating in the area with a view to building a case for prosecuting the individuals involved and local residents have expressed their approval at the installation of these new cameras. Furzedown SNT are eager to obtain statements from local residents evidencing the behaviour of those involved in any anti social behaviour and intend to take action against them to facilitate an improved quality of life for local residents.

Furzedown SNT, Wandsworth Council Representatives and Dog Control Wardens have also visited local residents in the area regarding the anti social behaviour of dog's and their owners. Civil action will be taken against those residents persisting in this behaviour.

## Spate of burglaries

During the summer months Furzedown Ward has experienced an increase in residential burglaries. These crimes are currently being investigated.

We would like to remind residents to be vigilant and not to leave windows and doors open, as this will encourage opportunist burglars who will enter your premises and steal items of value, i.e. Laptop computers, cameras, jewellery and electrical goods.

We would also like to advise residents to ensure their homes are properly secured if intending to leave their premises unattended.

**Your insurance company may not honour insurance claims if you have neglected to take reasonable precautions to secure your premises sufficiently.**

Please also be aware of bogus callers masquerading as officials from utility companies who will try to gain access to your home and burgle you using a distraction method. All officials carry photo identification with a contact number to verify the identification of a representative, you can also set up passwords with utility companies as an extra safeguard.

*If in doubt keep them out*
